While vehicle regulations are becoming more globally harmonized, safety standards in emerging markets still vary considerably.

The Global New Car Assessment Programme together with UNECE is displaying two cars to illustrate the important role that crash tests play in promoting occupant protection. After a frontal impact test at 64 km/h one car scores zero stars while the other achieves five stars. This is a huge difference in levels of safety and shows the importance of applying UN regulations. UNECE and Global NCAP would like to encourage countries to join the 1958 and 1998 Agreements to ensure that harmonized regulations for vehicles are applied all around the world.

The exhibition will be opened on 14 April at 09:00 by Mr Friis Bach, UNECE Executive Secretary, Mr van Schreven, Ambassador of the Netherlands and Mr Ward, Secretary General of Global NCAP.

ITC is committed to promote Intelligent Transport Systems as included in its 2012 strategy. Among many ITS applications, some are specifically designed to save lives. The core of road safety is prevention. In case of a potential road crash, the driver may no longer be able to react in the last moment. This is the moment when technology can come in and correct human errors. Autonomous Emergency Braking (AEB) uses laser/radar/camera systems to detect impending collisions and automatically applies the brakes if the driver does not react in time; and has been estimated to reduce low speed collisions by 20%.


