Agenda Item 3: Election of Officers

1. The Group of Experts elected a new Bureau to serve for a term of two years.

Agenda Item 4: Workshop on sustainable management of fossil fuels in electricity generation

- 2. The Group of Experts concluded that a focus on increasing the flexibility and efficiency of coal-fired electricity generation, decreasing emissions from the power sector, and development and deployment of carbon capture, use and storage (CCUS) would be critically important to enhance the overall efficiency of the electricity systems of ECE member States.
- 3. In response to the Committee on Sustainable Energy's request to explore possible additional activities, the Group of Experts concluded that a number of important emerging issues, such as development of standards and guidelines for cleaner electricity production, or recommendations for financing new and retrofitted coal-fired power plants should be part of the Group of Experts' core activities.

4. In response to the Committee on Sustainable Energy's request to the Group of Experts to consider changing its name to something more broadly focused on electricity systems, the Group of Experts recommended to change its name to the Group of Experts on Clean Electricity.
