Project Details

- Focus countries: Central Asia and the Caucasus ... extended to include Mongolia and Afghanistan
- Purpose: to facilitate these economies to build capacity on the UNFC and its application
- Two-day workshop in Almaty, Kazakhstan, 10-11 December 2009
- Budget: initially USD 36,000 from ECE Technical Cooperation budget, but more than doubled through contributions and in kind support from BP, CRIRSCO, Ernst & Young, Ross Petroleum (Scotland) Ltd, RWE Dea AG, State Commission of Ukraine on Mineral Resources and Statoil
