Departmental remarks: The target for this performance indicator should be 100% in theory. At the same time, in 2012-2013 the average across all MEAs with reporting obligations is 80%. Therefore, the aim of this indicator is to measure the reporting rate with a baseline in 2012-2013 with a view to continuously increase it until reaching 100%.

Strategy

The responsibility for the subprogramme is vested in the Environment Division. To achieve, the objective, the subprogramme strengthens a country needs-based approach in its work. To this end, it will focus on strengthening the capacity of the countries of Eastern and South-Eastern Europe, the Caucasus and Central Asia in environmental policy making and management, including for the effective implementation of environmental legislation. Through the multilateral environmental agreements (MEAs) serviced by ECE, effective environmental governance will be promoted in the ECE region and beyond.

The subprogramme will promote sound environmental governance and will further strengthen integration of environmental concerns into sectoral policies through the implementation of ECE policy tools, legal frameworks, sharing national experiences and best practices in the ECE region and beyond, in response to interest expressed by non-ECE countries particularly in several MEAs which have been opened by their Parties for accession by all United Nations Member States.

The subprogramme will continue to conduct environmental performance reviews and assist countries in the implementation of the recommendations resulting from their national environmental performance reviews. Furthermore, it will monitor the impact of such recommendations on policy formulation and implementation of the beneficiary countries. The subprogramme will also strengthen their national capacity for providing timely and accurate environmental data which will contribute to improved environmental monitoring and reporting on the environmental performance. The subprogramme will further promote the use of the ECE guidelines by member States for environmental monitoring and assessment.

The subprogramme will contribute to sustainable development in the ECE region as well as to the integrated and coordinated follow-up and the implementation of the outcomes of the regional and global summits and conferences on environment and sustainable development, including the United Nations Conference on Sustainable Development (Rio+20 Conference) and to the post-2015 development agenda.

⁵ **Methodology:** <u>Variable:</u> After a review, an assessment of the implementation of recommendations addressed in the previous Environmental Performance Review is performed; performance indicated as a percentage of implemented recommendations. **Departmental remarks:** This performance indicator measures the implementation by countries of recommendations made through the Environmental Performance Reviews. As such, it should be noted that the non-implementation of recommendations does not fall under the direct responsibility of the secretariat.

Actions will be taken to further integrate environment into other sectoral policies through intersectoral programmes and projects, including education for sustainable development; transport, health and environment; as well as water and health. Cross-sectoral work will also include the promotion of synergies between the ECE legally binding instruments and the cooperation between their secretariats. The subprogramme, in partnership with other regional and international stakeholders and players, will also promote and facilitate cross-border cooperation between countries, particularly through the relevant ECE MEAs.

Emphasis will be placed on supporting the implementation of ECE multilateral environmental agreements and regional and subregional action programmes, as well as multi-stakeholder processes and partnerships resulting from, inter alia, the World Summit on Sustainable Development, the Rio+20 Conference, and the work of the High-Level Political Forum, as appropriate.

External factors

The subprogramme is expected to achieve its objective and expected accomplishments on the assumption that, at the country level, there is: (a) political will and sufficient capacity to integrate environmental concerns in policy formulation and to implement national legislation taking into account the ECE environmental legal agreements; and (b) sufficient awareness of environmental issues and active support of the public in the implementation of national and regional policies.
