- Assistance to CSOs by granting, capacity building, strengthening networking and their viability



Capacity Building to Put the Aarhus Convention into Action: Ongoing Activities

- Strengthening regional cooperation on environmental governance through participatory and informed decision-making and implementation processes (funded via ENVSEC initiative)
- Capacity Building to Put the Aarhus Convention into Action and Support Development of PRTR Systems in Selected SEE Countries (Germany)
 - Developing and implementing a capacity building programme for officials and NGOs at local level to integrate and apply public participation in decision-making on EIA or SEA

- Set up planned public participation process, including public hearings, linked with concrete decision-making processes
- Provide training and follow-up coaching
- Prepare practical toolkit on how to plan and implement public participation during decision-making



Capacity Building to Put the Aarhus Convention into Action: Ongoing Activities

- Increase the awareness and build the capacities of judges, prosecutors, ministry officials and NGOs in order to understand and implement the access to justice requirements of the Aarhus Convention, stimulate communication between institutions and stakeholders
 - Interactive trainings for the judiciary on AC, related EU directives, national and international environmental legislation in cooperation with the judicial training centers
 - Roundtable meetings for legal professionals and NGOs in selected countries to discuss barriers and how to remove or reduce them
 - Facilitate NGO strategy meetings via trainings
 - on access to justice issues



Capacity Building on the PRTR Protocol: Ongoing Activities

- Assist environmental agencies in setting up and operating PRTR systems and preparation for the ratification of the PRTR Protocol in line with the E-PRTR requirements
- Build awareness and understanding of operators and NGOs about their role and actions, responsibilities and benefit
 - Supporting implementation of PRTR Protocol (legal, institutional and technical requirements), multi-stakeholders meetings to discuss the necessary developments (FYR Macedonia, Serbia)
 - Awareness-raising and training on the use of PRTR and PRTR reporting (BiH, Kosovo, as defined by UNSCR 1244,MN)
 - Organizing dialogue between authorities and operators to improve the reporting process, guidance materials (Serbia)
 - Pilot activities in selected countries (Albania, FYR of Macedonia)
