ACCESS TO JUSTICE IN ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS

Article 9 of the Aarhus Convention

- Aims at :
- Protecting the right to access to environmental information
- Protecting the right to public participation in environmental decision-making
- Enforcing national law relating to the environment

Access to Justice in Environmental Matters – the most challenging issue

- Sensitive area within the Party's jurisdiction having old legal traditions although Parties have taken on obligations in this area
- Implementation of the Convention in this area might require changes in the general judicial framework that go beyond the competence of the ministries of environment
- Low awareness among legal professionals and other stakeholders
- Increasing quantity of communications from the public to the Aarhus Convention Compliance Committee that shows inefficiency of the existing remedies
- Many communications directly allege non-compliance by the Party concerned in the area of access to justice

- Exchanging of best practices with regard to criteria for standing (Art. 9, paras. 1 and 2)

 - Extending the mandate of the Task Force on Access to Justice
 - Focusing on standing, costs and remedies
 - Continuing capacity-building efforts

 - Analytical and training material
 - Collection and dissemination of the case studies
