1945 Over 75,000 employed at Trafford Park



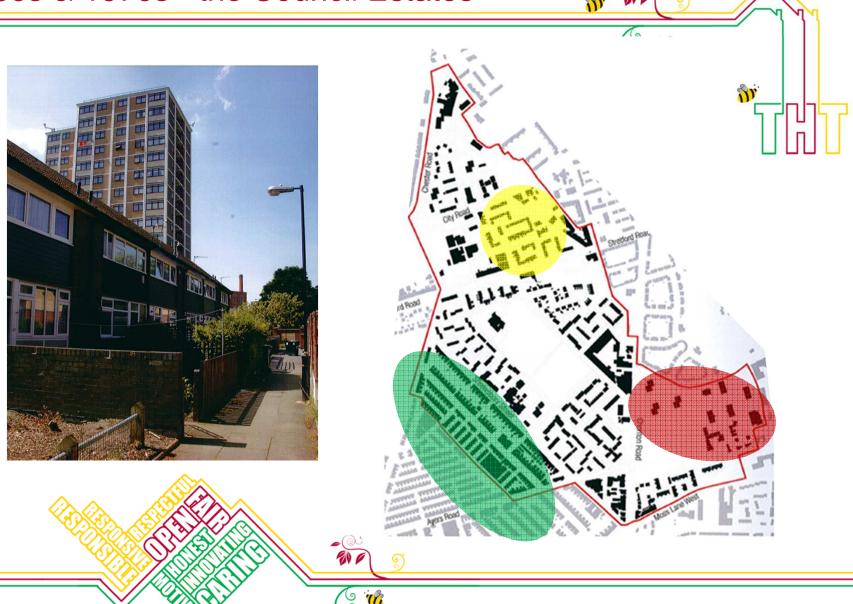




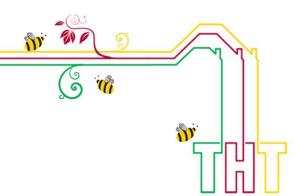




1960s & 1970s - the Council Estates



The Decline of the Area



1960+ Trafford Park in Decline

Large quantity of terraced housing is replaced by council estates

1976 Trafford Park now only employs 15,000 people

1987 Trafford Park Urban Development Corporation formed and starts
to reverse the decline in industry

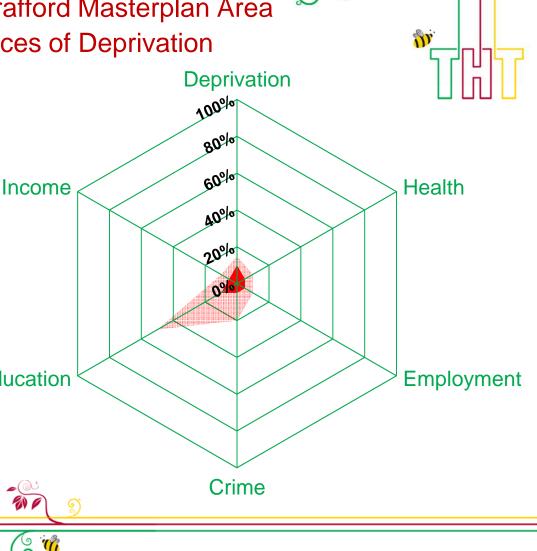
2008 The 1,400 companies based on Trafford Park employ 35,000 people



Social & Economic Problems – Statistics

Percentile Rank of the Old Trafford Masterplan Area for some of the Key Indices of Deprivation

- Based on the 2007 Index of Multiple Deprivation (Source: Communities and Local Government)
- Most of the area was in:
 - The most deprived 10% nationally
 - The bottom 10-20% for crime
 - The bottom 5% for health
 - The bottom 5% for employment ucation

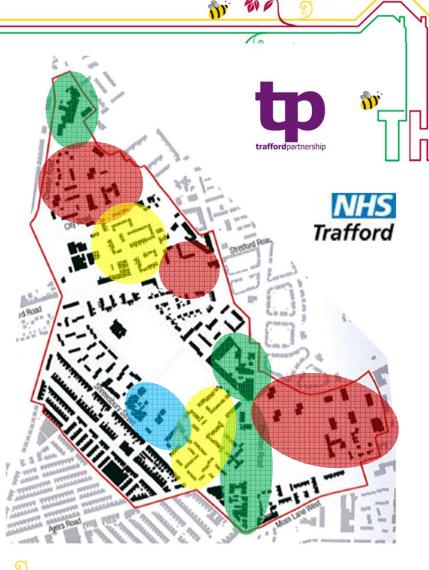




The Proposed Projects

- 2 Community Hub
- De-"Radburning", small amounts of New Build and improvements to open spaces
- New Build Developments on privately owned land





Community, Employment & Training Initiatives

Building and Regeneration Contractors give a % of the jobs generated to local residents, including some Apprenticeships



- Guns and Gangs Project Firearms Offences fell from 13 to 1 a year Youth Crime fell by 14%
- CleanStart Social Enterprise Provides Employment Opportunities for local Ex-Offenders Reduces Re-Offending Rates & Crime

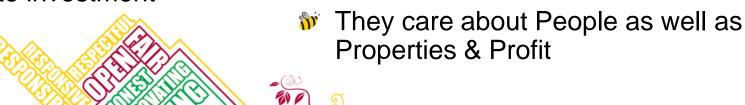


Conclusion

The Sustainable Development of an area such as Old Trafford, where value can only be unlocked in the long term, requires a holistic approach and partnership working.

- They are not as influenced by the changing winds of national & local politics as local government are.
- They have access to national and local government subsidy, be it in the form of loans, grants or land, as well as the ability to attract private investment





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
