Benchmarking of Best Practice

 Best Practice Benchmarking describes the comparison of performance data obtained from studying similar processes or activities and identifying, adapting and implementing the practices that produced the best performance results



Benchmarking of Best Practice

- What are the best practices?
- What improvement opportunities should we focus upon?

- Demonstrate strengths and weaknesses
- Justify need for reform and improvement
- Monitor performance and improvement
- Catalyst for innovation
- Promotion of universal standards
