PCC establishment

14 October 2002, the representatives of the institutions responsible for cadastre in the Member States of the European Union constituted the Committee

One of the conclusions of the "First Congress on Cadastre in the European Union" held in May 2002 under the auspices of the Programme of Activities of the Spanish Presidency of the E.U., was to propose the creation and start-up of the "Permanent Committee on Cadastre in the European Union"



Mission





•To raise the awareness of the activities related to Cadastre developed by the European Union and the Member States

•To develop strategies and propose common initiatives with the aim of achieving greater coordination among the different European cadastral systems and their users


The principles

- Activities focused exclusively on the Cadastre issues and on the needs of users of cadastral information
- Activities of the Member States of the European Union and of candidate countries
- The representation limited to a single institution per country for each Member States



Roles

- sharing and promoting best practices


Link between cadastral institutions and the organs of the European Union and other entities requiring cadastral information to carry out their activities



Future of cadastre






- Recognize current and future needs and expectation of the users of cadastral information (citizens, business sector and administration)
