

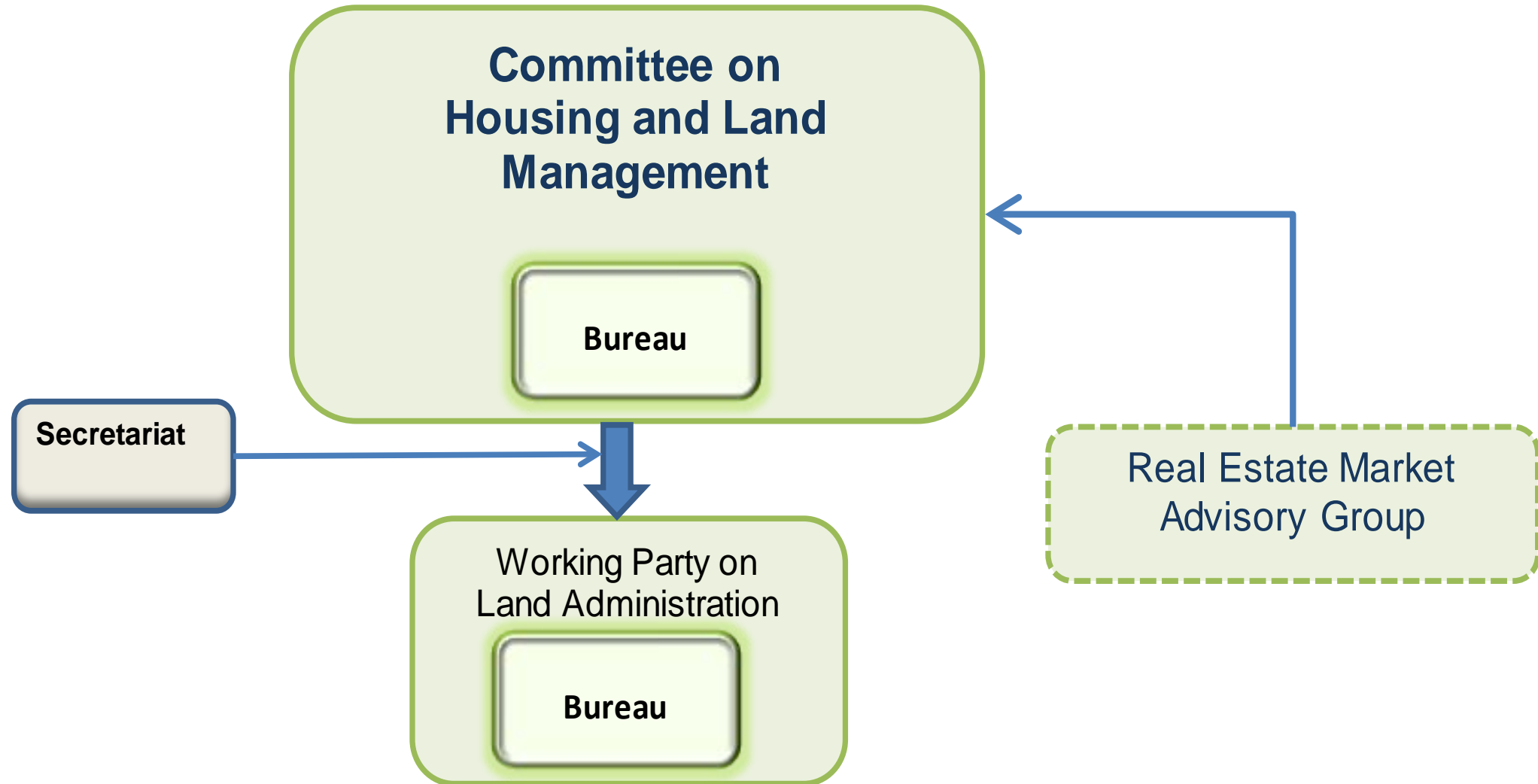

11.3. By 2030, enhance inclusive and sustainable urbanization and capacity for participatory, integrated and sustainable human settlement planning and management in all countries

11.6. By 2030, reduce the adverse per capita environmental impact of cities ...

11.7. By 2030, provide universal access to safe, inclusive and accessible, green and public spaces, in particular for women and children, older persons and persons with disabilities

Smart City Indicators – the process

- The Committee on Housing and Land Management decided at its 75th session in October 2014 to add the smart city project to its Programme of Work.
- A draft list of indicators was developed by a consortium a member of which is Environment Agency Austria. The set was tested in Austria. Pilot project in Goris, Armenia.
- The work on the indicators will build on the experiences of other UNECE divisions.

Milestones for the adoption of the list of indicators

- Expert consultation, 11 May 2015
- Workshop and Committee Bureau meeting, 4 and 5 June 2015, Rakvere, Estonia
- A draft will be send to the Committee's focal points for comments
- The Committee will be invited to adopt the indicators at its session on 14-15 December 2015
