B. Regional process

- 69. The Habitat III secretariat has been coordinating with the five regional economic and social commissions and the UN-Habitat regional offices to prepare five regional reports for Habitat III, which will build on the national reports received from the Member States of the United Nations.
- 70. The regional meetings are expected to have a wide range of participants, to discuss priorities for the New Urban Agenda and to issue recommendations in the form of a final declaration by the participants. The final declarations from regional meetings will be considered official inputs to the Habitat III process and will be published on the Habitat III web page.

C. Global process

72. At the global level, a report will be prepared, drawing on the national and regional reports. It will include all available knowledge, resources and data, as input to and support for the preparatory process of the Conference.

Legal framework for reporting to HIII

- 1. Many key actors in regional preparations;
- 2. Role of the Regional reports in the process they will inform the global report, but not an "official input" to HIII;
- 3. Official regional input: the final declaration of the regional meetings, as agreed by the participants No binding linkages between the regional reports and declarations of the regional meetings.
