



The Draft Political Declaration should combine four main elements








Building Block 1: Recent development and current situation

- ▶ Rise in dependency ratios
- ▶ Rise in mean age
- ▶ Fertility fluctuations
- ▶ Difference in life expectancy between men and women
- Differences between member States
- Specific challenges for countries in transition
- ▶ UNECE regional report on ageing






Building Block 2: Guiding Principles for Policies

- ▶ Monitoring, evaluation and following up







Modified elements

UNECE

- Inform citizens about new initiatives and reforms
 - RIS para. 9 and 14; Elements for 2007 para.12
- Promote "real empowerment" and involve civil society in decisionmaking processes
 - "bottom up approach" of RIS; Elements para. 17
- Point at "age discrimination" and abuse
 - RIS para. 8; Elements for 2007 para. 20
- Promote a new approach in care to optimize the functioning of human beings' capacities
 - RIS Commitment 7; Elements for 2007 para. 26
- Focus on prolonging life free of disability
 - RIS Commitment 7; Elements for 2007 para. 28



New elements (1/2)

UNECE

- Improve the quality of policy advice in the whole ECE region through capacity building
 - Elements para. 19
- Introduce a systematic approach to programme development

- Integrate the concerns of minorities

- Consider the importance of customs and traditions

- Enhance the follow-up process by compiling data and policy-relevant indicators

 - Strengthen the capacities of national and local authorities through capacity development

 - Recognize contributions from Austria and Spain and call for voluntary contributions

 - Strengthen the central role of the UNECE secretariat by establishing an intergovernmental body
