



Basis: Men and women aged 20 - 49 years





"If you were to have a/another child during the next three years, would it be better or worse for the joy and satisfaction you get from life?"











Family formation may improve partnership

"If you were to have a/another child during the next three years, would it be better or worse for the closeness between you and your partner/spouse?"










Families enjoy no special prestige

"If you were to have a/another child during the next three years, would it be better or worse for what people around you think of you?"










Security in old age hardly influenced by having children

If you were to have a/another child during the next three years, would it be better or worse for the care and security you may get in old age?"










Children don't really matter for a female life

Basis: Persons aged 20 – 49 years








... and for a male life neither

Basis: Persons aged 20 – 49 years










Women expect worse employment opportunities...

"If you were to have a/another child during the next three years, would it be better or worse for your employment opportunities?"










... and men expect that for women as well

"If you were to have a/another child during the next three years, would it be better or worse for your partner's/spouse's employment opportunities?"










(Potential) parents fear worse financial situation

"If you were to have a/another child during the next three years, would it be better or worse for your financial situation?"










Children reduce free options

"If you were to have a/another child during the next three years, would it be better or worse for the possibility to do what you want?"










More money and better time options very important

Agreement (important and very important) to composite family political measures, men and women in eastern and western Germany

Basis: Persons aged 20 – 49 years with at least one child under 14 years in their household










Large families rather need money, small rather infrastructure

Agreement (important and very important) to composite family political measures by number of children

Basis: Women aged 20 - 49 years, childless resp. with children under 14 years, by parity










Improved family policy particularly attractive for 1-child-families

Agreement (important and very important) to Q: "If your preferred family political measures were introduced which would be the consequences for your own life?"








Considering to have a child by age
