





Instrument for modernization


- The necessity to reinforce legal frameworks to guarantee the independence of statistical systems and to strengthen the mandate for wide access to existing information sources, including administrative ones
- Model Law Generic Law on Official Statistics (GLOS)





Armenia Law on Official Statistics, 9 April 2018






Legal framework

Official statistics are statistics developed, produced and disseminated in accordance with the requirements of the UN Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics, exclusively reflected in statistical programs that are the numerical expression of the essential phenomena of public life.





Basic Principles

- Guarantee independence, integrity and accountability
- Assure data quality and data confidentiality

The standards for the national system of official statistics in Armenia:






Old Law State Statistics

- did not define the NSS, mainly regulated the work of Armstat
- Armstat is the only producer of state statistics
- statistics produced by other public authorities administrative statistics

New Law Official Statistics

- focuses on the establishment of the NSS of producers of Official Statistics
- Armstat is the main producer
- gives administrative registers a clear status of data source for Official Statistics (respondent)




What is administrative data?

- Data collected by national and local authorities for administrative purposes in conformity with legal basis other than statistical legislation
- Organized in administrative registers
- Administrative registers are individual targeted datasets maintained by national and local authorities that are used for administrative purposes










Rights - Obligations -

Armstat has the mandate to access to administrative data


 line ministries and public institutions are obliged to grant access to their data for statistical purposes

 they shall consult Armstat a major revision or a new data collection

ON DATA DELIVERY TO ARMSTAT AND COOPERATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE DATA QUALITY







Register-based Population Census




Next Population Census in 2021

Planned for 2020, but because of COVID-19 pandemic postponed

- First time, the combined Census,
 based on the Population Register and 25%
 sample collection of additional data by tablets
- Pilot Census, October 3-12, 2019
- Tested: Population Register data updated with the data of Border Electronic Management System Register







COVID-19 as an opportunity

> To improve the quality of administrative registers




- > example, the Tax administrative register
- ➤ to promote more effective collaboration between different administrative registries (in particular, tax and social registers)








- Establishing IT infrastructure
