Introduction

1. The Conference of European Statisticians decided at its 2003 plenary session that an Annual Statistical Programme of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) be regularly compiled.

2. The main purpose of the Statistical Programme is to give an overview of all statistical activities carried out by the various Divisions and Units of the UNECE. The compilation of the Statistical Programme facilitates the work of the UNECE Statistical Division in fulfilling its mandate of coordinating the statistical activities of the UNECE, and of the Conference of European Statisticians and its Bureau in providing guidance to other Sectoral Committees on statistically related activities. It also serves as the basis for reporting the work undertaken by the Conference of European Statisticians (CES) to the Executive Committee of the UNECE.

3. The Statistical Programme is prepared by the UNECE Statistical Division. It is compiled for a calendar year.

- 4. The presentation of the statistical activities conforms to the following structure:
 - I. <u>Statistical activities undertaken by the UNECE Statistical Division</u>: 38 statistical activities by the Statistical Division are identified and grouped into nine clusters:
 - Coordination of international statistical work in the UNECE region.
 - Collection, processing and dissemination of macroeconomic statistics.
 - Collection, processing and dissemination of social and demographic statistics.
 - Support for processing and dissemination of statistics.
 - Methodological work in economic statistics.
 - Methodological work in social and demographic statistics.
 - Methodological work in environment and sustainable development statistics.
 - Methodological work on cross-cutting issues of official statistics.
 - Technical assistance to UNECE member countries.
 - II. <u>Statistical activities undertaken by other UNECE Divisions</u>, including 7 activities.

5. A short summary description of the overall objective and main actions of the cluster is provided in the beginning of each cluster. The description of statistical activities has the following structure:

Part I. Activities undertaken by the UNECE Statistical Division

1. Coordination of international statistical work in the UNECE region

Summary description of the cluster

Objective:

Ensure coordination of international statistical activities in the UNECE region and provide a forum for Heads of national and international statistical organizations to address issues of current interest, exchange experience, and develop standards and recommendations to improve national statistics and their international comparability. Promote the Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics within the region and the international statistical community.

Actions:

1) Act as the Secretariat of the UNECE Sectoral Committee on statistics, the Conference of European Statisticians (CES) and its Bureau,

2) maintain a database of international statistical activities in the region (DISA),

3) coordinate the work of the Teams of Specialists (Steering Groups, Task Forces, Groups of Experts, etc.) working under the umbrella of the CES;

4) as a custodian organization of the Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics, promote their implementation in the region and carry out global assessments of national statistical systems;

5) coordinate the technical cooperation activities in statistics in Central Asia.

Activity 1.1: Database of International Statistical Activities (DISA)

Description and objectives

Maintain an online database providing information on statistical work of about 30 international agencies. The Database of International Statistical Activities (DISA) is an important tool to assist the Bureau of the Conference of European Statisticians (CES) in fulfilling its primary role – to coordinate the statistical work undertaken by the various international agencies in the UNECE region.

- Prepare and publish the 2010 issue of the database.
- Start the preparations for the 2011 issue of the database.
- Provide input to the in-depth reviews of the CES Bureau in specific statistical areas where significant developments have taken place, coordinated action is needed or there is a lack of activities at the international level.
- Monitor the use of the database and ask for feedback in order to improve presentation and functionality of the database.

Activity 1.2: Secretariat support for the work of the CES and its Bureau

Description and objectives

Provide secretariat support for the work of the Conference of European Statisticians (CES), the Sectoral Committee of the UNECE Statistical Division and its Bureau that steers the work of the Conference. The CES coordinates the statistical activities of the three main international organizations working in the UNECE region, Eurostat, OECD and UNECE, as well as the statistical activities of other organizations, such as CIS-STAT, UNSD, IMF, ILO, WHO and the World Bank. The CES provides a forum for Heads of national and international statistical agencies to address issues of current interest, discuss the region's common statistical problems, exchange experience, and formulate common solutions and recommendations.

- Organize and service the CES Bureau meetings (February 2010 (a short meeting during the UNSC session), June 2010, and October 2010).
- Organize and service the annual plenary session of the CES (Paris, the week of 7-11 June 2010), which includes three modules: a session on formal business and two seminar sessions.
- Provide secretariat support in the preparation of the CES seminars on "*The impact of the global crises on statistical systems*" and "*Spatial statistics/Role of a spatial dimension in official statistics*" during the CES 2010 plenary session.
- Coordinate the implementation of follow-up activities of the CES 2009 and 2010 plenary sessions.
- Prepare the UNECE Statistical Programme 2011.
- Report on the work of the CES to the EXCOM.
- Coordinate the Teams of Specialists that work under the auspices of the CES in various statistical areas and report on their activities to the Conference and its Bureau.

Activity 1.3: Monitoring the implementation of principles for official statistics

Description and objectives

Monitor the adherence to, and advocate for, the UN Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics in UNECE Member countries, with special focus on the countries of Eastern Europe, Caucasus and Central Asia (EECCA) and South-East Europe (SEE). Ensure adherence to the Principles Governing International Statistical Activities within UNECE Secretariat.

- Follow-up on the survey on implementation of Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics in the EECCA and SEE countries.
- Support the implementation of Fundamental Principles in EECCA and SEE countries, by providing advice for legislation on official statistics.
- Promote the full implementation of the Principles Governing International Statistical Activities in the UNECE Secretariat.
- Carry out global assessments of national statistical systems, at the request from countries.

Activity 1.4: Coordination of technical cooperation in Central Asia

Description and objectives

Coordinate the technical cooperation in statistics carried out by international and national organizations in Central Asian countries, contribute to the Partner Reporting System on Statistical Development (PRESS), maintained by PARIS21 (Partnership in Statistics for Development in the 21st Century). This reporting system is developed by a Committee for the Coordination of Statistical Activities Task Team in cooperation with the UNECE Statistical Division.

Activities and output

- Coordinate technical cooperation in statistics in Central Asian countries.
- Provide timely and comprehensive information on all UNECE technical cooperation projects in statistics as a contribution to the global Report on donor activities in the field of statistics produced annually by PARIS21.
- Organize the Annual SPECA Project Working Group Meeting on Statistics (June 2010) to discuss the technical cooperation activities in Central Asia.

2. Collection, processing and dissemination of macroeconomic statistics

Summary description of the cluster

Objective:

Make available reliable, timely and comparable data on core indicators on short-term and structural economic statistics for all the countries of the UNECE region, and a number of different regional aggregates within the UNECE area.

Actions:

Maintain an online macroeconomic database in the following areas: national accounts main aggregates, industrial production, labour force, wages, price indices, purchasing power parities, exchange rates, interest rates, balance of payments and external debt.

2. Collection, processing and dissemination of macroeconomic statistics

Activity 2.1: Economic data collection, analysis and advice (Economic database)

Description and objectives

Collect, process and publish economic statistics for the UNECE Member Countries in a publicly available database with online access via English and Russian interfaces. The database provides comparable data on core indicators on short-term and structural economic statistics for all the countries of the UNECE region and a number of different regional aggregates within the UNECE area.

- Maintain an online database providing macroeconomic data in the following areas: national accounts main aggregates, industrial production, labour force, population, wages, price indices, Purchasing Power Parities, exchange rates, interest rates, and balance of payments, external debt.
- Improve quality of published data, focusing on better coverage, timeliness, relevance and comparability, in line with the UNECE data quality framework.
- Improve coverage of seasonally adjusted data for selected macro-economic series.

3. Collection, processing and dissemination of social and demographic statistics

Summary description of the cluster

Objective:

Make available reliable, timely and comparable social and demographic statistics with gender breakdown, and data relevant to the achievement of the goals contained in the Millennium Declaration (MDGs)

Actions:

1) Maintain an online database providing data with gender breakdown in the following areas: population, fertility, families and households, work and the economy, education, public life and decision making, health and mortality, crime and violence, science and information and communication technologies, and life balance;

2) Maintain a regional repository of data to monitor the achievement of MDGs.

3. Collection, processing and dissemination of social and demographic statistics

Activity 3.1: Gender statistics database

Description and objectives

Collect, process and publish gender statistics for the UNECE Member Countries in a publicly available database with online access via English and Russian interfaces. The database provides a comprehensive framework of statistical indicators on gender-relevant issues, and is geared to guide countries in establishing national frameworks for monitoring gender equality.

- Maintain the database in the following areas: population, fertility, families and households, work and the economy, education, public life and decision making, health and mortality, crime and violence, science and ICT, and life balance.
- Improve quality of published data, focusing on better coverage, timeliness and comparability, in line with the UNECE data quality framework.
- Prepare a plan for further development/consolidation of database topics following input from the 2010 Work Session on Gender Statistics.
- Make available timely sex-disaggregated statistical data relevant to gender policy analysis. Introduce data on selected small UNECE countries in areas where data are readily available.
- Implement a marketing strategy and disseminate materials to promote the database.

3. Collection, processing and dissemination of social and demographic statistics

Activity 3.2: MDG database

Description and objectives

Maintain a user-friendly regional repository of data to facilitate regional and national monitoring of the progress towards the goals specified in the Millennium Declaration in countries of Central Asia and East and South-East Europe. Provide data that are not currently available from international sources and include: i) additional indicators relevant for the region and ii) additional disaggregations by sex, geographical level and ethnic groups, where possible. This activity will be carried out in conjunction with other UNECE activities on MDG monitoring and reporting.

Activities and output

- Collect and publish relevant, timely and harmonized statistics for monitoring the goals specified in the Millennium Declaration in countries of Central Asia and East and South-East Europe.
- Establish a publicly available Regional MDG Database in cooperation with UNICEF, UNDP, and United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA).
- Establish MDG focal points in each of the NSOs and make available online networking tools to facilitate communication at national, regional and international levels.
- Develop a marketing strategy and materials to promote the database.

Summary description of the cluster

Objective:

Provide information on the activities of UNECE Statistical Division and maintain the necessary tools to support the processing and dissemination of data.

Actions:

1) Maintain and develop the database infrastructure for processing and dissemination of data;

2) Prepare publications, articles and promotional materials to publicize the work of the UNECE Statistical Division.

Activity 4.1: Infrastructure for processing and disseminating statistical data

Description and objectives

Maintain and develop the necessary database infrastructure to support the processing and dissemination of statistical data. Coordinate UNECE data production regarding the consistency of statistical data and terminology, and the use of data collection, storage and dissemination methods.

- Ensure a database system to meet the needs of users, allowing the collection, processing and dissemination of UNECE statistical data (Statistical Division, Transport Division, Trade and Timber Division).
- Progress towards full implementation of the internal quality framework for the collection, processing and dissemination of data by the UNECE.
- Improve data quality, consistency of time series and consistency across different databases.
- Provide an infrastructure for free of charge Internet dissemination of UNECE statistical data, in English and Russian, to all interested users.

Activity 4.2: Dissemination of information, promotion of statistical activities and support to clients

Description and objectives

Provide statistical data and information about the activities of the UNECE Statistical Division. Improve awareness about UNECE statistics and the Conference of European Statisticians. Maintain a good perception of UNECE statistics among the external users.

- Prepare up-to-date, relevant and well-presented statistical information and analytical notes for the "Facts and Figures" of "UNECE Weekly", as well as short articles on an ad-hoc basis, reflecting important statistical events or news.
- Provide press releases for events and outputs that may attract the attention of the media, for distribution through the UNECE Information Office.
- Publish promotional materials (in hard-copy or through the website) for various purposes, notably "What UNECE does for you" and "Understanding Statistics".
- Produce promotional announcements for exceptional events and new outputs via the UNECE Statistics website and targeted mailing lists.
- Provide up-to-date information on the UNECE Statistics website about statistical activities of the UNECE and the CES in accordance to the needs of various target groups of users, as identified through usability testing.
- Actively participate in the implementation of the UNECE Web Content Management System and other activities of the UNECE Web Working Group. Improve the web communication of the UNECE, and ensure that statistical needs are reflected.
- Support external users of the information disseminated by the UNECE Statistical Division via the Internet, including timely replies to user requests.
- Improve further the IT tools for external user support.
- Produce quarterly analysis of access to individual data cubes, and web site traffic measured using Google Analytics.
- Conduct an annual satisfaction survey of database users.
- Manage and coordinate the Statistical Division's publications programme.

Activity 4.3: Statistical profiles of UNECE member countries

Description and objectives

Prepare the 2011 issue of "UNECE Countries in Figures" based on data from the UNECE statistical database. This publication is aimed to increase awareness about the UNECE region, and to promote official statistics and the UNECE in general.

- Provide a statistical overview of the socio-economic situation in countries of the region to non-expert users.
- Make available in paper and electronic format, key data for countries and territories in the UNECE region (subject to availability of official data).
- Update electronic data in the "Countries Overview" data cube, reflecting the proposed content of the 2011 paper version of "UNECE Countries in Figures".
- Finalise and submit for publishing the paper version of the 2011 issue (to be published by March 2011).

Summary description of the cluster

Objective:

Development and implementation of internationally recommended standards and practices to improve the quality and comparability of economic statistics, particularly in the areas of national accounts, globalisation, price statistics, business registers and short-term economic statistics.

Actions:

1) prepare manuals, guidelines, recommendations and compilations of best practices to help countries in implementing internationally recommended standards, classifications and good practices;

2) carry out research and surveys of country practices to analyse the status of implementation of standards and guidelines, and to develop recommendations;

3) provide a forum for exchange of experience, identification of best practices and developing common solutions to improve the quality and comparability of economic statistics;

4) provide technical assistance and advice to South-East European and EECCA countries to promote the implementation of standards and best practices.

Activity 5.1: National accounts

Description and objectives

Promote the implementation of the methodology of the System of National Accounts (SNA) in the UNECE region with an emphasis on SEE and EECCA countries. Carry out research work and surveys of country practices. Contribute to the development of the global implementation strategy for the 2008 SNA and the formulation and implementation of the regional action plan focusing on the SEE and EECCA countries.

Activities and output

- Contribute to the development of global implementation strategy and international methodological standards, guidelines and manuals for the implementation of 2008 SNA.
- Provide technical assistance to the SEE and EECCA countries in the development of the implementation strategies for 2008 SNA at country level, improvement of the availability and quality of national accounts data, and implementation of other international standards related to national accounts (e.g. economic classifications) in close cooperation with Eurostat, OECD and CIS-STAT.
- Contribute to the follow up work on the research agenda of the 2008 SNA, led by the Intersecretariat Working Group on National Accounts (ISWGNA).
- Provide technical assistance to the statistical office of Albania within the project of the UN Delivering as One Pilot, subject to the provision of financial resources. Organise a seminar and provide consultancies on implementation of 2008 SNA and improvement of related macroeconomic statistics.
- Organise the meeting of the Group of Experts on National Accounts (in cooperation with Eurostat and OECD) in April 2010 in Geneva.
- Organise a special session for EECCA and SEE countries in April 2010 in Geneva, backto-back with the Meeting of the Group of Experts on National Accounts.
- Organise a seminar on 2008 SNA and related economic statistics in a selected EECCA country.

Activity 5.2: Impact of globalisation on national accounts

Description and objectives

Provide a forum to review the main distortions in national accounts caused by the globalization of economies. Develop guidelines/best practices on how to deal with these distortions in the compilation and reconciliation of data for national accounts and their source statistics.

Activities and output

- Service the Group of Experts on the impact of globalisation on national accounts (GGNA), organised jointly with Eurostat and OECD. The Group coordinates its activities with other international initiatives undertaken in this area.
- Service the leadership sub-group of GGNA.
- Coordinate the preparation of and contribute to the document *Impact of globalisation on national accounts: practical guidance*. The draft document will be discussed at the 2010 meeting of GGNA and the final version submitted to the 2011 Conference of European Statisticians for approval.
- Draft operational guidelines on the implementation of the new treatment for recording of goods for processing and merchanting as requested by the Intersecretariat Working Group on National Accounts (ISWGNA) in support of the implementation of 2008 SNA.
- Organise the meeting of the Group of Experts on the impact of globalisation on national accounts (May-April 2010).
- Organise the meeting of the Leadership Group of the GGNA (Spring 2010).

Activity 5.3: Price indices

Description and objectives

Support development and implementation of internationally accepted standards and best practices in price statistics through international cooperation, methodological work and technical assistance, particularly in the South-East European and EECCA countries.

Activities and output

- Provide methodological and technical assistance on price statistics to SEE and EECCA countries to support implementation of internationally recommended practices.
- Serve as chair and secretariat of the Intersecretariat Working Group on Price Statistics (IWGPS).
- Contribute actively to the international work on price indices and international price index manuals, such as the CPI and PPI Manuals.
- Promote the *Practical Guide to Producing Consumer Price Indices*. A Supplementary Handbook to the Consumer Price Index Manual.
- Participate in the Organising Committee of the Ottawa Group on Price Indices.
- Organise a regional Workshop on price indices for Central Asian and possibly other EECCA countries, in September 2010, in Kyrgyzstan (see also activity 9.1).
- Organise a Meeting of the Group of Experts on CPI, jointly with ILO, in May 2010.
- Organise an IWGPS meeting in May 2010.

Activity 5.4: Business registers

Description and objectives

Support development and implementation of internationally accepted standards and best practices in the area of statistical business registers through international cooperation, methodological work and technical assistance, particularly in the South-East European and EECCA countries. The aim is to improve the quality and international comparability of statistical business registers in the region and reduce existing gaps between western and eastern countries, in particular in respect of the use of administrative data and other sources.

Activities and output

- Organise a workshop/training session in one or two EECCA countries on practical and legal issues related to development, maintenance and use of business registers in statistics.
- Conduct the survey on business registers in the UNECE countries, coordinated with the corresponding Eurostat inquiry.
- Prepare and disseminate an analytical report based on the results of the UNECE survey on business registers and supporting dataset.
- Initiate preparation of the meeting of the Group of Experts on Business Registers in 2011 in cooperation with Eurostat and OECD.
- Comparison of existing practices and NSOs preparedness of South-East European and EECCA countries for including enterprise groups in the statistical business registers and for producing business demography statistics based on business registers.
- Survey on the needs for guidelines on business registers in terms of a manual or handbook targeted at the South-East European and EECCA countries.
- Follow-up on the implementation of the revisions of NACE and ISIC classifications into business registers in South-East European and EECCA countries.

Activity 5.5: Short-term economic statistics (STS)

Description and objectives

Support development and implementation of internationally accepted standards, norms and best practices in the field of STS through international cooperation, methodological work and technical assistance, with special focus on the South-East European and EECCA countries.

- Assist South-East European and EECCA countries in improving international comparability of STS and in the implementation of seasonal adjustment techniques and methods for de-cumulation of statistical time series.
- Prepare practical guidelines on seasonal adjustment in English and Russian. The guidelines will be based on the experiences from regional workshops and broader international work on seasonal adjustment.
- Promote the new Index of Industrial Production Manual (UNSD) among South-East European and EECCA countries and, if requested by NSO, help in reviewing the consistency and international comparability of published Industrial Production Indices.
- Evaluate the need for preparing guidelines for on-line dissemination of STS in South-East European and EECCA countries.
- Support initiatives to align STS with National Accounts standards and NACE and ISIC revisions.
- Organise a regional Workshop on seasonal adjustment methods for Central Asian and other EECCA countries, February 2010.

Summary description of the cluster

Objective:

Development and implementation of internationally recommended standards and practices to improve the quality and comparability of social and demographic statistics, particularly in the areas of population and housing censuses, migration statistics, gender statistics, health statistics, crime and justice statistics, measurement of the quality of employment, indicators related to the goals contained in the Millennium Declaration, and statistics on income, living conditions and poverty.

Actions:

1) prepare manuals, guidelines, recommendations and compilations of best practices to help countries in implementing internationally recommended standards, classifications and practices;

2) carry out research and surveys of country practices to analyse the status of implementation of standards and guidelines, and to develop recommendations;

3) provide a forum for exchange of experience, identification of best practices and developing common solutions to improve the quality and comparability of social and demographic statistics;

4) provide technical assistance and advice to South-East European and EECCA countries to promote the implementation of standards and best practices.

Activity 6.1: Population and housing censuses

Description and objectives

Promote the implementation of the new *CES Recommendations for the 2010 Round of Population and Housing Censuses* and support countries in preparations for the next population and housing census taking into account the different methodological approaches adopted, including register-based censuses and other innovative approaches. Together with United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) and the European Commission, UNECE Secretariat leads assistance on population and housing census in South Eastern Europe and Central Asia.

Activities and output

- Provide support to member countries for the planning and successful implementation of a population and housing census in the 2010 census round, based on the *CES Recommendations for the 2010 Round of Population and Housing Censuses.*
- Provide training and technical assistance to EECCA and SEE countries in the field of population and housing censuses, based on their expressed needs and in compliance with the CES Census Recommendations (see activity 9.1 Statistical capacity building in SEE and EECCA countries).
- Report on countries' preparations and plans for the population and housing censuses of the 2010 round (in cooperation with UNSD and Eurostat).
- Organise a meeting of the Group of Experts on Population and Housing Censuses, in cooperation with Eurostat, to provide a forum for exchange of experiences among census experts in member countries and international organisations (dates and venue to be confirmed at the October 2009 meeting).
- Contribute actively to the International Monitoring and Observation missions in Kosovo and in Bosnia and Herzegovina, aimed at ensuring that the next population and housing censuses are planned and conducted in accordance with the internationally agreed standards (in particular the CES Census Recommendations and the Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics) and that the enumeration is fair and impartial.
- Contribute to the Regional Commissions Inter Regional Cooperation for Disaster Evaluation and Risk Management, by helping Central Asian countries to use data from the next census for activities related to disaster management and preparedness (to be confirmed and subject to availability of resources).
- Develop a work plan, in cooperation with UNSD, Eurostat and possibly other organisations, to prepare and disseminate methodological material on census quality evaluation.

- Provide secretariat support to the CES Steering Group on gender statistics and the related task forces.
- Maintain the UNECE/World Bank Institute Gender statistics website.
- Contribute to the Inter-Agency Working Group on gender statistics.
- Organise the Work Session on Gender Statistics on 26-28 April 2010 and the Workshop on Gender Statistics on 29-30 April 2010.

- Provide secretariat support to the Steering Group on Health Statistics and the Task Force on Measurement of Health Status.
- Organise the Work Session on the Measurement of Health Status, in cooperation with WHO and Eurostat, on 20-22 January 2010.
- Organise the Meeting of CES Task Force on Measurement of Health Status in May 2010.

- Organise a Regional meeting on MDG indicators in October 2010.

Activities and output

- Provide secretariat support to the work of the CES Task Force to update the Canberra Group Handbook on Household Income Statistics.
- Contribute to the review of the Canberra Group Handbook.
- Draft revised version of the Handbook, expected to be ready at the end of 2010.
- Organise a Meeting of the Task Force in August 2010, Switzerland, in conjunction with the IARIW (The International Association for Research in Income and Wealth) conference.

4) provide technical assistance and advice to South-East European and EECCA countries to promote the implementation of standards and best practices.

Activity 7.1: Sustainable development statistics

Description and objectives

Develop a broad conceptual framework for measuring sustainable development responding to the demand for greater harmonisation and comparability in this area. Ensure that the work on measuring sustainable development remains within the framework of official statistics and is coordinated with other international organisations.

Activities and output

- Further pursue the conceptual development of the capital approach in identifying indicators to present the long-term dimension of sustainable development. Special attention is to be paid to indicators in the area of social and human capital.
- Explore possibilities to develop indicators that link the capital approach concept to policyoriented indicators.
- Provide secretariat support to the new Task Force on measuring sustainable development a joint initiative of the UNECE, Eurostat, and OECD.
- Organise the second meeting of the Task Force on measuring sustainable development, scheduled in spring 2010.

Activity 7.2: Environmental indicators

(Joint activity with the UNECE Environment, Housing and Land Management Division)

Work on methodological issues of environmental indicators in cooperation with the UNECE Environment, Housing and Land Management Division and UNSD, New York, in order to further strengthen environmental data collection, enhance the production of pan-European environmental indicators, and promote comparability of environmental statistics in EECCA and SEE countries.

Activities and output

- Provide practical recommendations on the use of statistical classifications, data collection methods and procedures for the production of indicators.
- Reinforce the cooperation between environmental experts and statisticians on methodological issues of environmental indicators.
- Exchange information on international developments related to environmental indicators.
- Strengthen the capacity of countries' national statistical offices in launching regular publication of environmental statistics compendiums and in modernizing the existing ones.
- Evaluate the *Guidelines for the Application of Environmental Indicators in Eastern Europe, Caucasus and Central Asia* prepared by the Working Group on Environmental Monitoring and Assessment (WGEMA) from the point of view of official statistics.
- Organise a joint meeting on environmental indicators for EECCA and SEE countries together with the Environment, Housing and Land Management Division and UNSD, New York in spring 2010 (see also activity 9.3).

Activity 7.3: Statistics related to climate change

Description and objectives

Promote the development of official climate change statistics in the region taking into account the activities of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), and other institutions dealing with related data.

Activities and output

- Survey the degree to which the national statistical offices are involved in climate change related work and in compiling the greenhouse gas (GHG) inventories.
- Identify the common concerns to be dealt with at international level.
- Explore the possibilities to contribute to the UNECE climate change activities in areas like transport, energy, forestry and housing in cooperation with other UNECE Sectoral Committees.
- Develop a project proposal related to the use of statistical classifications in the compilation of emission inventories, in line with the recommendations of the UN Roadmap for the development of official climate change statistics.

Activity 8.1: Management of statistical information systems

Description and objectives

Coordinate the work of the Steering Group on the Management of Statistical Information Systems (MSIS) to: (i) provide a forum for exchange of experiences; (ii) make recommendations on the coordination of the activities of different international organizations in this area; (iii) collect, discuss and make available good practices; (iv) facilitate and encourage implementation of standards and recommendations in the field of statistical data processing in the UNECE region.

Activities and output

- Support the improvement of statistical information systems in national and international statistical organizations.
- Improve harmonisation of data models, concepts, etc. in the field of statistical information processing.
- Provide a platform for data and knowledge sharing among statistical organisations in this area.
- Provide a technological and organizational set-up to facilitate sharing of statistical software, modules and solutions.
- Prepare recommendations for the governance and practice of sharing statistical software.
- Standardize electronic data interchange, in particular, develop and promote the Statistical Data and Metadata eXchange (SDMX) content oriented guidelines and other SDMX standards in cooperation with other international organizations.
- Provide secretariat support to the Steering Group on Management of Statistical Information Systems.
- Organise the Meeting on Management of Statistical Information Systems (MSIS April 2010).

Activity 8.2: Statistical data editing

Description and objectives

Enhance the harmonization of methods and concepts, and facilitate the exchange of experience and practices in issues related to statistical data editing.

Activities and output

- Contribute to the improvement of the quality of statistical data produced by official statistical organisations in the region.
- Strengthen the cooperation among experts on issues related to data editing and imputation, exchange of experience, harmonization of methods and concepts and development of new methods and techniques.
- Develop methodological guides on data quality control, data editing and imputation.
- Update and expand the Internet Knowledge Base (K-base) on statistical data editing.
- Develop proposals for future concrete outputs of the work sessions on statistical data editing.

Activity 8.3: Statistical confidentiality and access to microdata

Description and objectives

Enhance international cooperation, harmonization of methods and exchange of experience in the area of statistical confidentiality. The work covers managerial, statistical and organizational issues related to statistical confidentiality protection and disclosure control for both microdata and tabular data. Particular attention is paid to issues related to use of administrative registers and records for statistical purposes, for example linking and matching of records, legal and technical aspects, use of combined sources, etc.

Activities and output

- Identify leading practices in national and international statistical organizations in statistical confidentiality protection and disclosure control.
- Implement and further explain applicable standards and recommendations.
- Consider specific issues related to use of administrative registers and records, as well as linking, matching and integrating data sets.
- Follow-up to the 2009 work session on statistical disclosure control, focussing on the identification of future concrete outputs from this work.
- Collect information on the implementation of the CES Principles and guidelines on confidentiality and data integration in preparation for the review of these principles by the CES in 2011.

Activity 8.4: Statistical metadata

Description and objectives

Facilitate harmonisation of data models and structures for statistical metadata. Provide a forum for discussing metadata issues relevant to statistical offices. Complement other international initiatives dealing with data collection needs of international statistical organizations.

- Advocate for statistical metadata issues and the role of metadata in the management of statistical processes.
- Further develop and improve the Common Metadata Framework (CMF), a guide for statistical organisations to existing metadata standards, guidelines and recommendations.
- Develop parts B "Metadata Concepts, Standards, Models and Registries" and C "Metadata and the Statistical Business Process" of the Common Metadata Framework in cooperation with the METIS Steering Group.
- Add more case studies on the implementation of metadata systems in statistical organizations (Part D "Implementation").
- Provide secretariat support to the CES Steering Group on Statistical Metadata
- Organise a Work Session on Statistical Metadata in March 2010.
- Cooperate actively with other organizations on the standardisation of electronic data interchange, including the SDMX content oriented guidelines and other SDMX standards.

Description and objectives

Promote good practices in the dissemination and communication of statistical information.

Activities and output

- Prepare for publishing a new issue of the series *Making Data Meaningful*. These series present a compilation of good practices in the dissemination and communication of statistical information. Continue work on further issues to ensure continuation of the series.
- Exchange information and experiences through regular meetings of the Work Session on Statistical Dissemination and Communication.
- Provide secretariat support to the Steering Group on statistical dissemination and communication.
- Organise a Work Session on statistical dissemination and communication in May 2010.

Objective

Progress in implementation of international standards and good practices by statistical systems, particularly in countries of South-East Europe (SEE) and Eastern Europe, Caucasus and Central Asia (EECCA).

Actions

Carry out technical assistance to build the statistical capacity of SEE and EECCA countries in various areas, such as national accounts, short-term economic statistics, MDG indicators, population and housing censuses, gender statistics, migration statistics, measuring violence against women, Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics, organization of statistical systems, communication and dissemination of statistics, etc.

9. Technical assistance to UNECE member countries

Activity 9.1: Statistical capacity building in countries of South-East Europe and Eastern Europe, Caucasus and Central Asia

Description and objectives

Improve the statistical capacity in countries of South-East Europe (SEE) and Eastern Europe, Caucasus and Central Asia (EECCA) by enhancing their ability to meet the needs of data users at the national and international level. Increase substantially the production and publication of gender relevant statistical information aiming to provide better basis for knowledge-based policy formulation on equal opportunities for women and men.

Activities and output

- Technical assistance on developing Millennium Development Goals indicators, in support of statistical capacity building in member countries of the UN Special Programme for Economies of Central Asia (SPECA): Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan. The following technical assistance projects are in implementation stage in 2010:
 - The inter-regional UN Development Account Project of the 6th Tranche (2009-2011) "Supporting MDG-based development strategies through integrated regional action" implemented jointly in 2009-2011 with UNESCAP. UNECE is focusing on disaggregation of selected MDG indicators for improved monitoring of development needs in the target countries.
 - The global UN Development Account Project of the 7th Tranche (2010-2012)
 "Strengthening statistical and inter-institutional capacities for monitoring the MDGs and reducing indicators' discrepancies between national and international sources". UNECE is focusing on better reconciliation of national and international MDG indicators in the framework of this project and in the UNECE Statistical Division's work on building up a regional MDG Database (see activity 3.2 of this Programme).
- Technical assistance on developing short-term economic statistics, in support of Statistical capacity building in Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Mongolia, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan. The following technical assistance project is in implementation stage in 2010:
 - The project "*Challenges in Short-term Economic Statistics*", funded by the World Bank (2009-2011). The project focuses on short-term economic statistics, seasonal adjustments and price statistics. Two training workshops are planned to be organised in 2010: on seasonal adjustments and on Consumer Price Indices.
- Technical assistance on developing migration statistics, in support of statistical capacity building in Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Russian Federation and Tajikistan. Other countries that may also be involved include: Armenia, Georgia, Turkmenistan, and Uzbekistan. The following technical assistance project is in implementation stage in 2010:

- The global UN Development Account project of the 6th Tranche (2009-2011) "Strengthening national capacities to deal with international migration". The UNECE components of the project are focusing on two aspects (1) strengthening evidence-based policy making by promoting the use of statistics on international migration, and (2) developing the statistical capacity of data producers and promoting the exchange of data between countries.
- Technical assistance on **engendering statistical information and providing statistical information on violence against women** in support of statistical capacity building in selected countries in the EECCA and SEE countries. The following technical assistance projects are in implementation stage in 2010:
 - The "*Capacity Building program on Engendering National Statistical Systems for a Knowledge-Based Policy Formulation in EECCA and SEE countries*", funded by the World Bank in 2006-2010, implemented in collaboration with the World Bank Institute. The following activities will be carried out in 2010:
 - Organization of regional, sub-regional and national training workshops.
 - Finalization of training materials.
 - Assistance to NSOs in developing methodology, performing surveys, and making use of registries for production and dissemination of engendered statistical information.

The beneficiary countries are Albania, Armenia, Belarus, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Montenegro, Serbia, Tajikistan, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Turkmenistan, Ukraine, UN Mission in Kosovo (UNMIK) and Uzbekistan.

- The global UN Development Account Project of the 6th Tranche (2009-2011) *"Enhancing capacities to eradicate violence against women through networking of local knowledge communities"*. In this global project, the role of UNECE is to facilitate interregional exchange of experience, and to develop and test a short statistical module on violence against women based on a core set of indicators approved at the 40th session of the UN Statistical Commission.
- ◆ Technical assistance in the field of **national accounts** in Albania (*One UN Pilot project* 2009-2011). Raising awareness of the main users on the importance of internationally comparable statistics in the context of EU pre-accession. Advisory services on the implementation of the revised system of national accounts (SNA 2008), measurement of Gross Domestic Product and key national accounts indicators, and development of a system of quarterly accounts.
- Technical assistance in support of the preparations for the first Population and Housing Census in Bosnia-Herzegovina and in the internationally administered territory of Kosovo, planned to take place in 2011, in cooperation with UNFPA, Eurostat and other involved international organizations. This includes participation in the International Monitoring and Observation missions in Kosovo and in Bosnia and Herzegovina, aimed at ensuring that the next population and housing censuses are planned and conducted in accordance with the internationally agreed standards (in particular the CES Census Recommendations and the Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics) and that the enumeration is fair and impartial.
- Joint Training Workshops with the Statistical Institute for Asia and the Pacific (SIAP) for **strengthening the statistical capacity** in countries which are members in both UNECE

and UNESCAP. Beneficiary countries are Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan, possibly also Armenia and Georgia.

 Joint workshop(s) on improving communication and dissemination of key statistics with UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs (DESA) in the framework of the UN Development Account Project of the 7th Tranche (2010-2012) "Improving the dissemination and communication of key statistics and indicators, especially those needed to monitor progress toward the MDGs and internationally agreed development goals". Activities within the framework of this DESA-led project in the UNECE region are still to be defined.

9. Technical assistance to UNECE member countries

Activity 9.2: Short-term technical cooperation

Description and objectives

Provide specific advisory services in statistics to South-East European (SEE) and Eastern Europe, Caucasus and Central Asia (EECCA) countries in areas where the Statistical Division of UNECE has a recognised expertise, upon request.

Activities and output

- Provide short-term assistance to UNECE countries, upon request by national authorities or international organizations, with special emphasis on SEE and EECCA countries. Technical assistance is provided in a wide range of areas as required, such as: general organization of the national statistical system, national strategy for the development of statistics, statistical legislation, dissemination and marketing of statistical information, population census, migration, gender statistics, short-term economic indicators, national accounts, etc.
- Participate as facilitators, lecturers and discussants in seminars, training workshops, conferences and meetings on topics mentioned above.
- Carry out Global Assessments of statistical systems in UNECE member countries in cooperation with other international organisations and specialists.

Activity 9.3: Planned technical assistance projects subject to availability of external funding

Description and objectives

Providing technical assistance to meet country requests in areas where external funding is being negotiated or sought (status of June 2009).

- Support for improved statistical literacy and evidence-based decision making in SEE and EECCA countries by improved dissemination of official statistics.

Increasing the knowledge of sources of statistical information among existing and potential users of statistical information.
- Organize a workshop focusing on the legal and practical issues related to developing the business registers (BRs) in selected National Statistical Offices in SEE and EECCA countries. More specific themes would be the use of administrative sources for updating BRs, linkages between administrative and statistical units maintained in the BR, and ways to improve the quality of statistical BRs for better use in the compilation of business statistics.
- Support for selected countries to build up dissemination databases for selected SEE and EECCA countries, making use of the expertise and know-how accumulated in UNECE on dissemination systems of aggregated statistical information.
- Support for the development of price statistics in SEE and EECCA countries, including, inter alia, improved calculation methods, population and regional coverage and coverage of goods and services, inclusion of owner occupied housing, methodologies for replacements and quality adjustments, updating of the sample and methods for data collection and validation, calculation of long, fixed based time series of price indices and Purchasing Power Parities.

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• Support to the EECCA and interested SEE countries to further strengthen and harmonize environmental data collection, producing pan-European environmental indicators and promoting comparability of environmental statistics.
