Background: before the Task Force

- The 2018 UNECE-Eurostat Work Session on Migration Statistics: use of Facebook and Twitter data for migration statistics
- The Conference of European Statisticians (CES) Bureau (October 2019): new data sources for producing official statistics on international migration and cross-border mobility
- The 2019 UNECE-Eurostat Work Session on Migration Statistics: work towards using new types of data sources and review existing examples of use of new data sources

TOR: the steps towards the Task Force

UNECE Steering Group on migration statistics: terms of reference for the Task Force on the use of new data sources for measuring international migration and cross-border mobility.

Examples need to be collected and analyzed, to support national statistical offices in embarking on the use of new data sources.

Objective and Activities

 The Task Force in charge from March 2020 to June 2022. The works started in August but the deadline has not been postponed

 The objective is to develop guidance for national statistical offices on the use of new data sources for measuring migration and cross-border mobility.

The participants

The following statistical offices are participating in the Task Force:
 Australia, Canada, Georgia, Italy, Mexico, New Zealand, Turkey, United
 Kingdom, United States, Eurostat, OECD and the United Nations Statistics
 Division.

The activity of the Task force: Informal questionnaire

- Two meetings (August and October)
- During the discussion the TF members tried to understand what should be included (concepts, data sources, topics, methodologies...) and how to include the experiences and plans in a final report
- A questionnaire helped to individuate the field of study.
 The form intends to collect information on the existing experience and plans in national statistical offices for using new data sources for measuring migration and cross-border mobility and to identify examples from outside official statistics where new data sources have been used for measuring migration and cross-border mobility.

The results of the consultation

- The core question: "Are you aware of processes/projects that currently use big and social media data for measuring migration and cross-border mobility?"
- 3 Yes and 6 No
- Example from NSOs: Geostat and US Census Bureau

Next steps and expected outputs

- Contact NSOs outside the TF to collect more experiences
- Bibliographic review
- Analyze the collected material to guide national statistical offices in the use of the new sources.
- Compile the guidance with examples into a reference tool and develop a mechanism for updating it with new examples
