UNECE and UN Environment capacity building mechanisms on Environment Statistics and Environmental-Economic Accounting

1. UN-Development Accounts, Environmental Pillar – Joint UNECE/UN Environment project

- Target countries: Eastern Europe, Caucasus and Central Asia (EECCA)
- Main objective: Strengthen capacity to measure and monitor SDG indicators in environment statistics areas. Focus on SDGs 6,7,12,13,14 and 15
- Activities: Country sensitization and initiation workshops, regional workshops, targeted training, advisory missions and other capacity building activities

2. Joint Task Force on Environmental Statistics and Indicators

- Target countries: EECCA and South-Eastern Europe
- Main objectives: Assist to a) implement SEIS data methodologies, b) implement SEEA, c) communicate environmental data, d) environmental indicators for SDGs and Green Economy

3. Joint OECD/UNECE Seminars on SEEA Implementation

- Capacity building component, back-to-back training workshops planned

4. Expert Fora on Climate Change-related Statistics

- Capacity building component & support to the development of Roadmaps



Coordination with other initiatives and actors in the region (examples)

1. **UNESCAP:** Disaster-related Statistics & Capacity building on Environment Statistics and SEEA

 - a) WAVES (Natural Capital Accounting, e.g. in Kyrgyzstan)

 - c) Activities: needs and readiness assessments; technical support on environmental data sharing; and exchange of knowledge and lessons learned

 - a) GEF-funded CCCD project in Bosnia and Herzegovina
 - b) Technical support to Montenegro and Serbia on testing of IRIS tool

Main Activities in 2017

Regional training on SEEA (autumn 2017)

- Blended learning module of UNSD
- E-learning, webinars, workshop
- Russian version of e-learning module currently being set up (Note: official Russian version of SEEA-CF now available!)

Joint UNECE/UN Environment National Training Workshop on Environment Statistics & SDGs in Astana (Kazakhstan) 25-28 April 2017

- Basic training on UN-FDES and SEEA
- Focus on waste and water
- Identification of further capacity building needs to inform more training in 2018

1-2 further country missions

- to assess country needs and plan capacity building/training workshops (e.g. mission to Tajikistan on 12-13 June 2017)

- 13th Session: 29-30 June 2017 (Geneva, Switzerland)
- 14th Session: 2-3 October 2017 (Rome, Italy)

Planned activities for 2018 - 2019

Joint OECD/UNECE Seminar on SEEA Implementation

- 21-22 February 2018, probably with a back-to-back training workshop
- Another seminar is foreseen to be held in 2019

Expert Forum on Climate Change-related Statistics

- 1 meeting per year

Joint Task Force on Environmental Statistics and Indicators

- 2 meetings per year

Targeted country missions and regional activities under joint UNECE/UN Environment project (UNDA 10th tranche)

- As identified via country sensitization workshops

Targeted country missions + collection of lessons learned

- on sharing and using environmental data in reporting and assessment processes (under EU-funded SEIS Capacity Building project in Central Asia)
