- Global outlook studies (Rome)








EFSOS policy consequences, Budapest

- Endorsed EFSOS process and conclusions
- Recommended continued, even intensified analysis (e.g. of energy, of trends -> 2005)
- Recommended continuity of expertise through EFSOS group
- Suggested methodological improvements (emphasis on cross-sectoral and policy analysis, priority topics)
- Emphasized importance of country level actions







Cross-sectoral aspects, Riga

- Importance of cross-sectoral approach and potential for major synergies
- Be proactive, stop being inward looking!
- Identified potential for cooperation with water, energy, agriculture and rural development
- Systematically explore cross sectoral approach esp. EFSOS
