The discussion will be structured around three sub-themes: (i) Long-term strategy for South East Europe (ii) International support for South East Europe (iii) The political context for regional cooperation Each segment will be introduced by a Lead Speaker. The ensuing discussion, which will benefit from the conclusions of the previous day's seminar on the transition process after ten years, will involve representatives of Governments and other partners of ECE, including OSCE and the Council of Europe.

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General Notes

1. The fifty-fifth session of the Commission (3-5 May 2000) will be preceded by a seminar on 2 May, on "From plan to market: the transition process after ten years". Debate under the session's agenda items 2(a) and 2(b) will draw upon the seminar's discussion.

2. In accordance with the Commission's Rules of Procedure, the documents referred to in the Provisional Agenda will, wherever possible, be transmitted to Governments in the Commission's three official languages (English, French, Russian) not less than forty-two days before the opening of the session, i.e. not later than 22 March 2000.

3. As part of the ongoing efforts of all concerned to revitalize the sessions of the Commission, and in keeping with the previous session of the Commission, the Bureau recommends that delegations, PSB Chairmen and representatives from other organizations/initiatives should refrain from general statements and limit themselves to specific observations and proposals for action. Any delegation wishing to provide a text for distribution is requested to provide the secretariat, preferably in advance of the Session, with sufficient copies (approximately 75).
