Annual Report covering the period from 7 May 1999 to 5 May 2000

### INTRODUCTION

1. The present Annual Report was adopted unanimously by the Economic Commission for Europe (ECE) at the sixth meeting of its fifty-fifth session on 5 May 2000.

### **CHAPTER II**

### WORK OF THE COMMISSION SINCE ITS FIFTY-FOURTH SESSION

## A. Activities of subsidiary bodies

3. A list of meetings held since the fifty-fourth session is contained in Annex I, showing in each case the dates, the officers and the symbols of the report. These reports record the agreements reached and decisions taken.

### B. Other activities

4. The secretariat serviced the regular session of the Commission, meetings of its subsidiary bodies, and other meetings held under its auspices. A list of the reports submitted to the fifty-fifth session of the Commission is given in Annex II. Periodic reviews, including the Economic Survey of Europe, and a series of specialized statistical bulletins, were published. The secretariat maintained close and regular liaison with United Nations Headquarters and cooperated with the Departments concerned, as well as with the secretariats of the other regional commissions on projects of common interest.

## C. Relations with other United Nations Programmes

5. The cooperation of the Commission and its secretariat in 1999/2000 with various United Nations bodies and other international organizations, as well as with their secretariats, has continued as called for in the Plan of Action.

### **CHAPTER III**

### FIFTY-FIFTH SESSION OF THE COMMISSION

### A. Attendance and organization of work

- 6. The fifty-fifth session of the Commission was held from 3 to 5 May 2000. The Commission heard statements by the Chairman and the Executive Secretary.
- 7. The fifty-fifth session was attended by representatives from Albania, Armenia, Austria, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Canada, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Monaco, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Republic of Moldova, Romania, Russian Federation, San Marino, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and United States of America.
- 8. The session was attended by representatives of the European Community.
- 9. Representatives of the Holy See participated under article 8 of the Commission's terms of reference.
- 10. Representatives of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD), United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the following specialized agencies and intergovernmental organizations were in attendance: International Labour Organization (ILO), World Health Organization (WHO), World Bank, International Monetary Fund (IMF), World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO), International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA), Council of Europe, Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD), and Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE).
- 11. For discussion of the ECE cooperation with subregional groupings and initiatives, representatives of the Central European Initiative (CEI), Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS), Interstate Euro-Asian Coal and Metals Community (IEACMC) were in attendance.
- 12. The following non-governmental organizations were represented: International Council of Environmental Law; International Council of Women; World Federation of United Nations Associations; Zonta International.
- 13. A complete list of participants can be found in document E/ECE(55)/INF.1/Rev.1.

- 14. The Commission adopted its agenda (E/ECE/1375/Rev.1) as revised by the session, which read as follows:

# C. Election of Officers

- 15. The Chairman of the fifty-fifth session of the Commission was Mr. Harald Kreid (Austria) and the Vice-Chairmen Mr. Amiran Kavadze (Georgia), Mr. Miroslav Somol (Czech Republic) and Mr. Murat Sungar (Turkey)
- 16. Mr. Gordan Markotić (Croatia) was designated Rapporteur by the Bureau.
- 17. At its sixth meeting the Commission elected Mr. Harald Kreid (Austria) Chairman of the fifty-sixth session. Mr. Amiran Kavadze (Georgia) was re-elected Vice-Chairperson and Mrs. Spomenka Cek (Croatia) and Mr. David Peleg (Israel) were elected Vice-Chairpersons of the fifty-sixth session.

# D. Account of proceedings

# Greater cohesion within the ECE region

(Agenda item 2)

## (a) The economic regeneration of South East Europe

- 18. As called for in the Plan of Action, the secretariat organized a debate on a major economic theme. This year the theme chosen was the economic regeneration of South East Europe. Opening the session, the Chairman shared his perception of the Commission's role. The Executive Secretary also made some introductory remarks linking the selected theme to that discussed at the Spring Seminar the previous day. The debate was divided into three sessions:
- (i) Regenerating the economies of south eastern Europe: do we need a new approach to the transition process? (Session I): Mr. Ivo Bicanic (Professor, Faculty of Economics, University of Zagreb), Mr. Daniel Daianu (Professor, University of Bucharest and Minister of Finance (1997-1998)) and Mr. Hans Peter Lankes (Director of Transition Strategy, Office of the Chief Economist, EBRD) acted as discussion leaders.
- (ii) Supporting the transition process in South East Europe (Session II):
- (a) How should international financial and technical assistance be designed and organized, and what exactly should it support, to be really effective? Ms. Catherine Day (Deputy Director General, External Relations Directorate, European Commission, Brussels), Mr. Michael Landesmann (Research Director, Vienna Institute for International Economic Studies (WIIW)) and Mr. Milivoje Panic (Selwyn College, Cambridge University) acted as discussion leaders.
- (b) Can regional cooperation help to overcome some of the key problems?

  Mr. Vladimir Gligorov (Vienna Institute for International Economic Studies (WIIW)),

  Mr. Thomas Price (Coordinator of OSCE Economic and Environmental Studies, Vienna) and

  Mr. Genc Ruli (Director, Albanian Institute for Contemporary Studies, Tirana) acted as discussion leaders.
- (iii) Can strategies for economic policy and regional cooperation ignore the political context? If not, how should they adapt? (Session III). Mr. Ivan Krastev (Chairman of the Board, Centre for Liberal Strategies, Sofia), Mr. Bertrand Rioust de Largentaye (Ancien Chargé de Mission au Centre d'Analyse et de Prévision, Quai d'Orsay, Paris), Mr. Thanos Veremis (President of ELIAMEP (Hellenic Foundation for European and Foreign Policy, Athens) and Ms. Susan Woodward (Centre for Defence Studies, King's College, London) acted as discussion leaders.
- 19. As had been requested, the Chairman subsequently highlighted some of the main issues which had been addressed during the debate and informed delegations that a written version of his remarks would be made available to member countries.

# (b) Possibilities of increasing regional cooperation within the ECE region, taking into account the experience of the transition process

- 20. On the basis of a consultant's paper, the debate addressed the issue of regional and subregional cooperation in the ECE region.
- 21. The Commission reaffirmed the value of coordination and cooperation among regional organizations. With regard to the ECE, OSCE and the Council of Europe, three actors in the region working on economic, social and security issues on a region-wide basis, it underlined the importance of their complementarity and existing division of labour. It encouraged further efforts to both intensify and enhance the scope of this collaboration.
- 22. The importance of the ECE and the EU partnership was stressed and the further strengthening of working relations, in particular with regard to the future development and application of norms and standards, important tools for European integration, was requested.
- 23. The Commission further confirmed the importance of subregional cooperation as a necessary step towards regional integration. It underlined the positive impact of subregional cooperation for economic growth, investment and trade, as well as peace and security.
- 24. The Commission encouraged an enhanced role of ECE in supporting subregional groupings and initiatives and noted that ECE could apply the experience gained from supporting existing initiatives/groupings to a new programme developed for the Caucasus subregion.

# Operational activities: re-thinking the strategy (Agenda item 3)

- 25. The Commission reviewed ECE's operational activities based on documents E/ECE/1376 and Corr.l and E/ECE/1376/Add.l on how the secretariat could focus and organise its operational activities according to a better defined strategy, as well as Conference Room Paper No. 2. on "Inter-regional Technical Cooperation Initiative in the Mediterranean Region: Three Initial Proposals for Joint Cooperation."
- 26. The Commission reaffirmed the importance of ECE's operational activities as a way to enhance the implementation of ECE conventions, protocols, norms and standards, promoting best practices and agreed policies and supporting European cooperation and integration and the transition process. It recognized that the Regional Advisers continue to play an important role in advising and helping the countries in transition apply ECE norms, standards and conventions.
- 27. The Commission agreed that priority should continue to be given to demands for assistance from the most vulnerable transition economies, particularly those from CIS and Balkan countries. It also agreed that the decisions on which operational activities are selected and given priority should take into account guidance from intergovernmental discussions and be based on actual ECE expertise, and reflecting on the recommendations of the external auditors. Finally, there was

general agreement that ways to strengthen the Coordinating Unit for Operational Activities should be explored in order to facilitate its work in terms of selection, prioritization and evaluation of its activities.

- 28. The secretariat was requested to conduct results oriented evaluations of operational projects in order to help it prioritize its work, where feasible. There was also general agreement for the need to develop inter-sectoral and multi-sectoral approaches to operational activities.
- 29. The Commission encouraged countries to include ECE on their lists of eligible institutions for the receipt of funding. At the same time, the secretariat was encouraged to renew its efforts to attract funds, both from public and private sources.
- 30. The Commission welcomed the secretariat's initiative with regard to developing joint projects with ECA and ESCWA for the Mediterranean region as well as with ESCAP. It requested the secretariat to pursue its discussions with ECA and ESCWA after holding consultations with member countries to determine the areas of cooperation with the other two regional commissions. Some countries specifically requested to be informed by the secretariat in detail and in advance concerning the secretariat's tentative proposals in this field.

# Cross-sectoral and intersectoral concerns: Update on development with the participation of the Chairpersons of the Principal Subsidiary Bodies (Agenda item 4)

- 31. The Commission considered this item on the basis of document E/ECE/1377.
- 32. The Commission supported the priority given to transport and environment by the Inland Transport Committee, the Committee on Environmental Policy and their respective Bureaux. It encouraged the Joint Meeting on Transport and the Environment to actively pursue the overall monitoring and implementation of the Programme of Joint Action. Support was also expressed for the continuing work on transport, environment and health, energy and the environment, as well as by the Intergovernmental Task Force in preparing for CSD-9.
- 33. The Commission agreed with the suggestions by the PSB Chairpersons that it was necessary to initiate, on a regular basis, debates and possible action on cross-sectoral concerns and intersectoral issues, an example of which was mitigating the effects of CO2 emissions. The PSBs were requested to report back to the Commission on progress made in this respect.
- 34. The Commission supported ECE's involvement with the business community and generally agreed that this cooperation continue along the lines suggested in document E/ECE/1377. It was decided that the Group of Experts on the Programme of Work (or a sub-committee thereof) take up the issues outlined in the paper and highlighted at the meeting, in particular the development of guidelines and the possible procedures for facilitating public/private partnership. The PSBs were requested to examine issues, such as the strengthening of SMEs involvement in ECE activities.

35. The secretariat was requested to provide regular information on the development of the participation of the business community in its different committees and working groups.

# Contributing to global debates and events

(Agenda item 5)

- 36. The Commission reviewed ECE's contributions to global debates and events and strongly supported ECE's role as a regional arm of the United Nations called for in ECOSOC resolution 1998/46. It expressed its satisfaction with the ability of ECE to offer a region-wide forum on social and economic issues and to act as an interface between governments and NGOs.
- 37. The Commission expressed its full support for the conclusions agreed at the ECE Regional Preparatory Meeting for the 2000 Review of the Implementation of the Beijing Platform for Action, which constitutes the input of the ECE region to the global review process.
- 38. As a follow up to the International Year of Older Persons, the Commission decided to convene a ministerial conference on ageing under the aegis of ECE and accepted with appreciation the offer of the Government of Germany to host the conference in Berlin in September 2002. It further approved the preparatory process leading up to this conference as suggested in document E/ECE/1378. It also noted the willingness of the Government of Germany to make financial contributions to the preparatory process and urged other governments to support the process.
- 39. The Commission agreed that it would be necessary to look into the resource implications arising from ECE's contribution to global events and issues, including the possibility of strengthening the Office of the Executive Secretary. Taking into account the limited resources available to the ECE secretariat, the Commission agreed that any new mandate should be supported by the necessary additional budgetary resources coming from the body delivering the mandate.

# Report on the work of the Group of Experts on the Programme of Work (Agenda item 6)

- 40. In introducing document E/ECE/1380, the Chairman of the Group of Experts on the Programme of Work (GEPW) highlighted the work accomplished by the Group since the fifty-fourth session of the Commission and outlined some of its future tasks.
- 41. The Commission endorsed the recommendation contained in the document, namely: "In deciding that biennialization would not be in the best interests of the ECE at the present time, the Commission requests the Group of Experts on the Programme of Work to consider whether any improvements should be made to the format of the annual session of the Commission; any recommendations arising from such deliberations should be submitted to an Ad Hoc Informal Meeting of the Commission later in the year."

### Other business

(Agenda item 8)

- 42. The Chairman announced that the tentative dates for the holding of the fifty-sixth session of the Commission in Geneva were the week of 30 April-4 May 2001, taking into account the need to avoid choosing dates which might conflict with those of other important meetings.
- 43. The Commission agreed with the proposal contained in Conference Room Paper 1 on "Challenges to the region: elements for an ECE response" that member countries and PSBs provide comments on the paper by 15 June and that a discussion on the paper be organized during the Ad Hoc Informal Meeting in June to decide on further steps to be taken.

# Adoption of the Annual Report of the Commission

(Agenda item 9)

44. At its sixth meeting, on 5 May 2000, the Commission adopted its report covering the period from 7 May 1999 to 5 May 2000.
