Global role of UNECE region

- Most developed part of world (GDP total, GDP per capita, intl. trade)
- Most integrated region but high level of sub-regional disparities (G8, G20, OECD, EU, EIT)
- Positive: Diversity of economic cooperation/major ODA donor (MDGs)
- Biggest consumer of resources (e.g. ecol. footprint)
- Challenge: Reduce mat. and energy intensity of econ., to be leader in global tech. innovation,
 to be competitive and fair player in intl. trade

Multiple Crisis and UNECE

- Heavy impact on UNECE
- 2009: GDP slowed
- 2011: vital ecosystems under huge stress
- Impossible to continue with current patterns towards 2050's world population of 9 billion
- Equal sharing of benefits vital to ensure sustainable economic growth (good political, economic, social and envi. governance at all levels)

Multiple Crisis and UNECE (ctd)

- Seeking a new paradigm as a base for sustainable economic growth
- Promising concept:
- ✓ Green Growth Strategy (OECD)
- Green Economy (UNEP)
- ✓ Green Economy in the context of SD and poverty eradication (UNCSD, Rio+20)
- Understood in integrated and holistic manner

Green Economy/Growth

- 1 of tools for achieving objectives of SD
- Contribution to poverty reduction + job creation
- Core element recognition, evaluation and investment in natural capital (ecosystem services)
- Key tools —innovation and R&D, taxation
- Need for modified indicators beyond the GDP
- All related issues need to be embedded in context of SD!

Rio+20: State of play & next steps

- Rio+20 (4–6 June 2012): deliver outcomes on two themes to achieve threefold objective
- A lot of work done so far: Synthesis report, work of UN entities etc.
- Further steps determined by PrepCom-2 decision
- Inputs for inclusion in compilation text: 1 Nov 2011
- Zero-draft of outcome document: early Jan 2012
- Series of informal informals: three-day meeting in Jan 2012; one full week for negotiations in Feb, Mar and Apr 2012
- PrepCom-3: Rio de Janeiro, 28–30 May 2012

Role of UNECE in preparations

- 2 Bureau members designated to liaise with UN regional commissions
- Year 2011 will be crucial for regional inputs
- Forums for voices from the UNECE region:
- UNECE regional preparatory meeting for Rio+20
- 7th Ministerial Conference "Environment for Europe"
- OECD Ministerial Council meeting etc.
- Reflect other processes, e.g. preparation of Secretary-General's Report on global economic governance and development for the 66th UNGA session
- Send as clear and concrete messages as possible for inclusion in a compilation text

Possible results of Rio+20

- Pending on inputs from UN MS and entities, including UNECE, and forthcoming negotiations
- Examples:
- UN green economy roadmap
- Toolbox of best practices
- Decision on IFSD, including strengthening coordination role of UN regional commissions
