**Project title:** Improved production of the UNECE set of environmental indicators and implementation of the System of Environmental-Economic Accounting (SEEA) in the Eastern Partnership countries

**Expected timing/ duration:** July 2019 - January 2020

#### Objective and brief summary of the project:

The EU-funded European Neighbourhood Instrument (ENI) Shared Environmental Information System (SEIS) II EAST project represents the continuation of an on-going cooperation between the UNECE and the European Environment Agency (EEA) on SEIS in the six countries of the Eastern Partnership with the EU (EaP) (Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine), addressing the challenge of organizing a vast array of environmental statistics, data and information necessary for regular environmental reporting, based on the SEIS principles and practices. The objective of the proposed project is to further improve environmental reporting and national assessments and promote the comparability of environmental datasets and indicators in line with the UNECE Guidelines for the Application of Environmental Indicators. This would have a positive impact on national capacities of the countries of the EaP to monitor and report on progress towards the SDGs at all levels. The project will be implemented through the following activities:

- A1.1. Participation of the target countries (Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine) in the planned sessions of the 16<sup>th</sup> session of the Joint Task Force on Environmental Statistics and Indicators (Geneva, 28-29 October 2019);
- A1.2. Participation of the target countries in a seminar on the implementation of the System of Environmental-Economic Accounting (SEEA) (Geneva, date to be determined);
- A2.1. Review of the UNECE set of environmental indicators as part of updating and publishing the next edition of the UNECE Guidelines for the Application of Environmental Indicators in 2020.

#### **Expected results of the project:**

EA1. Strengthening capacities of national environmental authorities and statistical agencies of the countries of the EaP to collect and produce the required data sets, with quality assurance/quality control standards comparable with EU/EEA as input to the production and use of the UNECE set of environmental indicators in accordance with SEIS principles and practices;

EA2. Improved capacities of the countries of the EaP to prepare regular state-of-the-environment, indicator-based assessments and thematic assessments using comparable indicators and assessments in line with EU/EEA and UNECE best practice and the Framework for the Development of Environment Statistics (FDES).

#### Target group and beneficiaries of the project:

Beneficiary countries are Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine. The target group are experts from relevant ministries and agencies responsible for the development and production of environmental indicators and statistics.

#### Justification of project and its relationship to the programme of work:

The project is directly linked to the Expected accomplishment (c) "Strengthened national capacity for environmental monitoring and assessment systems in the countries of Eastern Europe, the Caucasus, Central Asia and South-Eastern Europe" of the Subprogramme 1 "Environment" of the UNECE Strategic framework 2018-2019 and the objective of the Subprogramme 1 "Environment" "to improve environmental governance and performance throughout the ECE region for safeguarding the environment and human health" of the UNECE Proposed programme budget for 2020.
