VI. Summary of achievements to date

During the reporting period one country mission to review the situation in relation to access to water and sanitation and small scale water supplies and sanitation was organized¹ in Belgrade, Serbia (8 December 2014). This was the first country missions (out of total 6) and it was carried out jointly by the UNECE and WHO/Europe.

The mission was organised as a consultative meeting, which involved over30 participants from key Ministries (Health; Agriculture & Environmental Protection; Construction, Transportation & Infrastructure; Labour, Employment and Social Affairs), the Institute for Public Health and its regional branches as well as civil society organizations. It proved to be a useful format in order to review the evidence base on the situation of small-scale water supply and sanitation services as well as of equitable

access to water and sanitation in Serbia. It demonstrated that Serbia faces many challenges related to the management of small scale systems. A request was formulated to carry out a comprehensive rapid assessment of small scale systems (will be facilitated by WHO/Europe in 2016). The mission also highlighted that despite the recognition of the human right to water and sanitation in the Serbian constitution, only limited measures have been taken and hardly any targeted financial resources have been allocated to improve equitable access to water and sanitation. Lack of data and lack of inter-institutional coordination were identified as a major challenge. Interest was expressed to apply the Equitable Access Score-card in one of the Serbian regions, Vojvodina. Official correspondence shall be shortly forwarded to the joint secretariat confirming above mentioned requests.

Information obtained during the mission stimulated fruitful discussions at the national workshop on the Protocol on Water and Health and target setting process (took place in Belgrade on 9 December 2014). Whereas the situation of small systems is fully addressed in the current draft targets, eequity aspects were highlighted for consideration in the further target setting process. Then it shall be reflected in the national targets drafted by the inter-ministerial working group and shall be adopted at the national level.

The lessons learned from the first country mission will serve as a basis to develop the format of future consultations which will be tailored to each beneficiary country situation and needs.

At the seventh meeting of the Working Group on Water and Health (Geneva, 26–27 November 2014), a number of requests were put forward by the beneficiary countries which assisted in planning future activities

There were limited project activities during the reporting period. Memorandum of Understanding between UNECE and WHO/Europe was signed on 16 September 2014 and was followed by the detailed discussion on planning and implementation of activities.
