EDF are likely shortly to apply to the Infrastructure Planning Commission (IPC) for planning consent for Hinkley Point C. Consultation on transboundary effects would form a part of the IPC's consideration of the application – guidelines have recently been issued. It is expected that Ireland will be notified. DECC will remain in close liaison with the IPC throughout the process and will have their first meeting very shortly. An application to the local authority for preliminary works has also been made by EDF. In response to query from [Irish official] regarding whether new build developers would engage with affected, neighbouring states before making their application, [DECC official] commented that he thought that EDF would want to be clear that they would proceed with the application before they did so. [He] agreed to provide a process timetable when this becomes clear. <u>ACTION 3:</u> UK (DECC) to provide Ireland with a timetable of next steps once the IPC have considered the Hinkley Point C application.
