**Saltsjöbaden VI Workshop. Clean Air for a Sustainable Future – Goals and Challenges (BACA Actions 30 and 33)**

**Description:** International science-policy workshop to be held in Gothenburg, Sweden, 19-21 March 2018. The workshop is called **Clean Air for a Sustainable Future – Goals and Challenges** and is directed towards key policymakers, scientists and other stakeholders active in supporting air pollution awareness and control on an international scale and is the sixth in a series within the so called Saltsjöbaden format. The overall objective of the workshop is to discuss and propose ways forward for international collaboration on air pollution.

The workshop will consider air pollution issues in relation to international conventions and other initiatives such as the Convention on Long-range Transboundary Air Pollution (CLRTAP), the EU legislation on Air Pollution, the Climate and Clean Air Coalition (CCAC), the Arctic Council/Arctic Monitoring and Assessment Programme (AMAP), the Stockholm Convention and the Minamata Convention. The discussions will be organized around a selected number of topics each of them representing a key area of importance for future air pollution strategies and international collaboration. The topics are concentrated on themes of relevance for both science and policy and will include; Clean cities; Clean air in a global context; The way forward in the EECCA region; Air pollution effects on ecosystems and the link to climate; Sectors, Sources and Solutions for further emission reductions.

**Expected outcome:** The outcome of the workshop will be a set of targeted recommendations and suggestions on the way forward. Each recommendation will be tagged with the name of the organization to which the recommendation is directed. This will make it possible to make sure that every recommendation will be taken seriously and can be monitored. The recommendations will be presented and discussed at meetings of relevant organizations and taken into account in the process of updating the Long Term Strategy of the CLRTAP.
