1. SUMMARY OF ACHIEVEMENTS TO DATE

The project began slowly but consultants to support the implementation have now been recruited and all national focal points nominated, so implementation is expected to accelerate in 2019. National focal points have been officially nominated in four target countries (Albania, Montenegro, Serbia, and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia). For Bosnia and Herzegovina, four focal points were nominated which represent the current division of environmental responsibilities in the country.

Four international consultants have been recruited to carry out activities related to EA1 "Enhanced national capacities of the selected countries of South-East Europe to assess the most critical aspects and priority needs in their environmental governance and policies". (a) Reviews of the implementation of the recommendations coming from environmental performance reviews (EPRs) vis-à-vis SDGs and targets and (b) need assessments for Albania, Montenegro and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia were drafted and submitted to the UNECE secretariat.
