Dear Fiona Marshall

First I can inform you about the latest development.

1. The Minister of Transport challenged the decision by the lower court to submit the case to the Eastern High Court as principal. The 9 June the Eastern High Court upheld the decision by the lower court meaning the case now can start at the High Court. First question to decide now by the High Court is whether BoM has sufficient legal interest since that has been challenged by the Ministry.

2. 7 May 2015 the Ministry of Justice decided not to give legal aid to plaintiff (BoM) arguing that BoM has no legal interest in the case. This Decision is under appeal to procesbevillingsnævnet which has informed me yesterday that they expect to take decision 25 June.

I enclose the two mentioned decisions.

For these reasons I don't find it possible to withdraw or modify the complaint and will ask the Compliance Committee to place this complaint on stand still waiting for the decision of the Eastern High Court and Procebevillingsnævnet.
