1. Project title/number: Euro-Asian Transport Links (EATL) (Phase 3 of Project E161)

2. Expected timing/duration: 2014-2016

3. Objective and brief summary of the project:

The objective of the EATL project is to assist countries to develop efficient, fast, safe, environmentally friendly and secure Euro-Asian land and land-cum-sea transport links, and to foster co-operation in the field of transport to facilitate international trade and tourism. Globalization has led to significant increases in trade and transport between Asia and Europe. While most of the traffic has used increasingly congested - maritime routes, further development of inland transport routes would provide credible and competitive additional transport options for traders and shippers. Once established, these efficient and integrated inland routes would become and effective tool for economic development and integration of the Euro-Asian region, including facilitating greater participation in the globalization process by Central Asia's landlocked countries.

The project intends to coordinate collection and analyses of data and best practices on infrastructure development among the beneficiary countries. The project builds upon the results achieved during the implementation of Phase 2 and contributes to the coordinated multi-country and inter-continental implementation of long-term infrastructure plans. The Group of Experts is the principal mechanism for coordinating the EATL work by the secretariat. The project aims to achieve the above objective by supporting the participation of representatives of CIS countries in the EATL Group of Experts meetings in the following focus areas:

- 1. Collection, analysis and dissemination of data regarding cargo flows provided by main Asian ports, producers and traders with the European markets;
- 2. Collection, analysis and dissemination of data regarding cargo flows provided by European ports, main import/export gateways of European countries;
- **3.** Preparation of a questionnaire to update the information provided by the comparison study of inland transport with existing maritime routes.
- 4. Preparation of common templates for information collection on integrated time schedules and tariffs; review and discussion of collected data with experts, and presentation of preliminary analysis. Designation of experts from rail organizations and road transport associations to contribute to the development of integrated time schedules and tariffs along the Euro-Asian links.
- 5. Discussion of updated information and ways how to convert the results of analysis into a web application tool.
- **6.** Discussion of the ways to promote rail and road transport services along the Euro-Asian transport links with marketing managers of rail organizations and road transport associations.

4. Expected results of the project:

- 1. Cargo flows (quantities and types) along the nine Euro-Asian rail and road transport links identified.
- 2. Coordination of time schedules and tariffs for the nine rail and nine road transport links improved.
- 3. An integrated Marketing strategy for promotion of Euro-Asian road and rail transport links developed.
- 4. The EATL Geographical Information Systems (GIS) application updated and upgraded.

5. Target group and beneficiaries of the project:

The beneficiary countries are: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Republic of Moldova, Russian Federation, Taiikistan, Turkmenistan, Ukraine, and Uzbekistan.

6. Justification of project and its relationship to the pr ogramme of work:

The activities of the project will contribute to the expected accomplishment (c) "Enhanced capacity in ECE member States, particularly in landlocked developing countries, for the development of the pan-European and transcontinental transport infrastructure and transport facilitation measures" of subprogramme 2, Transport, in the ECE Strategic Framework for 2014-2015. The project has direct relevance to the Programme of Work of Transport Division 2014-18 (Programme Activity 02.1 No.5), which requests continued efforts to implement Phase 3 of the EATL project to make EATL routes operational. The Russian Federation funding is provided solely for the participation of delegates from the 12 beneficiary countries specified above.
