Brief Summary of Activities

This AWP is developed in consultation with Country Offices and implementing partner in order to address the identified priorities.

RECA7PD1:

On gender disaggregated statistics UNECE in collaboration with Hacettepe University and selected UNFPA COs will contribute to reducing data gaps in gender indicators, with special focus on the standard gender indicators recommended by the Conference of European Statisticians by promoting and building capacity around gender-responsive data collection, analysis and use. The RP will support and contribute to two workshops on gender statistics, being organized by UNECE in March 2014. Results of these workshops will provide the basis for further collaboration between UNECE and Hacettepe University in designing a training curriculum on gender-responsive data collection, analysis and use.

On census activities support will be provided to editing and translating of the Conference of European Statisticians Recommendations for the 2020 Round of Population and Housing Censuses. In year 2015 RP funds will be provided for (sub)regional workshop aimed at evaluating, documenting and sharing experiences gained from the 2010 round and preparatory work for the 2020 round of population and housing censuses.

RECA7PD2:

The RP will work together with UNECE in the area of analysis of intra-national inequalities, capturing vulnerable groups and regional disparities with regards to poverty. To this extent the RP will support a workshop to be organized by UNECE in 2015 which will build capacity in national statistical offices and other relevant government agencies in measuring poverty and its determinants among women, youth and vulnerable groups. Said workshop follows recommendations from the UNECE seminar "The way forward in poverty measurement", which was held in December 2013 in Geneva.

RECA7CDI:

UNECE will develop a sustainability plan which outlines ways in which UNFPA supported activities will become sustainable by 2015.
