Brief Summary of Activities

The United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) is a key partner for EECARO in multiple ways. In past years the collaboration included the regional ICPD review, coordination and support to Population and Housing censuses across the region, support to building capacity on indicators for gender equality, and support to ageing policy formulation.

In 2016, the collaboration with UNECE regarding Population and Housing censuses will focus on preparatory activities towards the 2020 Round of Censuses. The modality of past years has proven to be cost-effective and will be retained: a two-day workshop dedicated to topics of special interest for EECA countries, followed by a three day meeting for all ECE member states. It may be noted that CIS-Stat has taken a pro-active role in organizing special sessions during the two-day workshop, with UNFPA support, and is expected to continue to do so in 2016.

UNECE's work on development and roll-out of a toolkit for calculation and standardization of indicators on gender equality will continue to be supported by UNFPA's regional initiative in 2016. A two-day workshop on dissemination of gender statistics will be held, followed by a three day work session on gender statistics. In an effort to further reduce costs, this year's workshop and meeting will be held in Vilnius.

As mentioned in respective IP workplans, Hacettepe University and CIS-Stat aim to engage in gender statistics activities which complement and augment the gender statistics work of UNECE, beyond providing outputs in their own right.

UNECE's Population Unit is a key partner of UNFPA with regards to activities related to ageing. The Population Unit hosts the annual meetings of the UNECE working group on ageing, and has been supporting countries in the EECA region with development of roadmaps for active ageing. In 2016, the regional initiative will support a regional workshop to identify and address data gaps for active ageing indicators.


