3. Objective and brief summary of the project:

The overall objective of this project is to support the removal of regulatory and procedural barriers to trade in Kyrgyzstan in a manner that contributes to the successful implementation of the National Strategy for Sustainable Development (NSSD) for 2013-2017. This objective will be achieved by developing action-oriented recommendations for: (i) removing behind and at-theborder regulatory and procedural barriers to trade in manufactured goods as well as in major agricultural products; and, (ii) deepening Kyrgyzstan's integration into regional and global value chains. The recommendations will be developed on the basis of rigorous analysis of regulatory and procedural measures governing trade in Kyrgyzstan using the ECE evaluation methodology and Business Process Analysis. The recommendations will be presented to the Government of Kyrgyzstan and shared with ECE member States at the Committee on Trade annual session, as well as during international conferences on regional integration and the Aid for Trade global review. In particular, the project objective will be achieved through the following strategy:

- 1. A study on regulatory and procedural barriers to trade in Kyrgyzstan.
- 2. A Business Process Analysis of trade in agricultural products in Kyrgyzstan.
- 3. Validation workshop of the study and the business process analysis (the workshop will be held in in Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan
- 4. A technical paper on deepening Kyrgyzstan's integration into regional value chains (English and Russian).
- 5. A technical paper on increasing the utilization of the EU Generalized System of Preferences (English and Russian
- 6. Validation workshop of the technical papers (the workshop will be held in in Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan

A roundtable on removing regulatory and procedural barriers to trade in Kyrgyzstan, which will be organized in Geneva, Switzerland as part of the annual session of the Sectoral Committee on Trade.

4. Expected results of the project:

The project aims to achieve the following results:

- 1. Increased understanding among relevant public and private sector stakeholders of best practices for improving regulatory cooperation, standardization policies and trade facilitation conditions in Kyrgyzstan.
- 2. Increased understanding among relevant public and private sector stakeholders of best practices for deepening Kyrgyzstan's integration into regional and global value chains.
- 3. Improved exchange of national experiences on removing regulatory and procedural barriers to trade in the ECE region.

5. Target group and beneficiaries of the project:

The target group includes relevant line ministries (e.g., line ministries of Economy, Ministry of Energy and Industry, Ministry of Agriculture and Melioration, Ministry of Transport and Communications and Ministry of Foreign Affairs); specialized agencies (State Customs Service, National Statistical Office, State Enterprise Single Window); and, enterprise support institutions of Kyrgyzstan.

6. Justification of project and its relationship to the programme of work:

The study and related activities have been requested by the Kyrgyz Government in its letter to the ECE dated 25 April 2014. The project is directly linked to expected accomplishment (d) "Enhanced national capacity of member States for trade policy development and implementation" of subprogramme 6, Trade, in the ECE Strategic Framework for 2014-2015.
