FAO-ECE Forest Communicators Network

October 3 - 6, 2005, Bialowieza, Poland

REPORT

MAIN OUTCOMES

The 13th meeting of the FAO-ECE Forest Communicators Network was hosted by the Ministry of the Environment of Poland and organized by the Polish State Forests National Holding in co-operation with the State Forests Information Centre. 41 people from 15 countries participated. The meeting was chaired by Mr. Ingwald Gschwandtl from Austria, Leader of the FCN.

The meeting elaborated a first outline for an international event on communication in forest sector policy, which according to the FCN's mandate is to be conducted by 2008. First views concerning objectives, participation, strategy, content and outputs of such an event were presented. A steering team was formed (Brita Pajari – EFI, Marta Gaworska – MCPFE, Alan Kocher – Switzerland, Kai Lintunen – Finland, Bob Burt – Canada, Colin Morton - UK and Tomas Kotovics – Latvia and Ingwald Gschwandtl – Austria), to develop further the concept and to consult with potential actors and sponsors. This team will present a concept for further deliberations to the FCN at the next meeting.

A subgroup was established, led by Mr. Gerben Janse (EFI), to start preparations for a guide on best practices in forest communications. The group will capitalize on existing material, such as examples already collected by Mr. Bob Burt (Canada) and will build on lessons learned and success stories of FCN participants. The outcome will be fed into the above mentioned international event.

Mr. Ewald Rametsteiner outlined the procedure for elaborating the second part of a study on consumer attitudes, which will specifically focus on the public perceptions concerning forest products and the forest industry. A questionnaire was sent out

recently to the FCN in order to collect results of as many as possible available opinion surveys, carried out by different institutions in the ECE region. Response is coming in already. The meeting participants identified several additional information sources. The material will be aggregated to a concise report, which will also provide substance for the above mentioned international event.

Spain offered to host the next FCN meeting in 2006, date and location to be specified. Ireland and Slovenia expressed interest in hosting a future meeting.

Conducted by Mr. Bob Burt from Natural Resources Canada, Mr. Kai Lintunen from the Finish Forest Assoziation, Mr. Colin Morton and Mr. Charlton Clark from the UK Forestry Commission in co-operation with other FCN members. Train the Trainers workshops are conducted by the FCN to introduce basic communications concepts and tools with relevance to forest and forest industries issues. They aim towards enabeling participants to act as instructors for forest communications. This years focus is on how to work with print and electronic media to gain better access and get messages out better.

October 5, 2005

Study Tour to the Bialowieza Promotional Forest Complex and the Bialowieza National Park:

Demonstration of activities carried out by the Forest Service within the Bialowieza Promotional Forest Complex providing an opportunity to discuss various aspects of public relations in forestry, followed by a visit to the Bialowieza National Park, the largest preserved pristine European forest, which is on the list of the World Biosphere Reserves (since 1977) and UNESCO World Heritage (since 1979).
