## **2. Matters of interest since the last session**

### **(a) UNECE and subsidiary bodies**

The secretariat will present the decisions taken by the 2009 session of the Committee on Trade and by the 2008 session of the Working Party on Agricultural Quality Standards having an impact on the work of the Specialized Section.

As the number of UNECE standards is limited for produce of only national or regional importance, German producers and traders propose to establish new UNECE standards for berry fruit, lambs lettuce, rocket, kohlrabi, carrots and other root vegetables, tubercle vegetables, stalk and stalk-leaf vegetables.
