Dear Mr. Kervella:

Please allow this letter to serve as our application for non-governmental, observer status with the UN Committee of Experts on the Transportation of Dangerous Goods (UNCETDG). The International Council of Chemical Trade Associations (ICCTA) provides the chemical distribution industry an effective and distinctive voice on European issues and could assist the UNCETDG in its deliberations to create worldwide, harmonized hazardous materials regulations.

An estimated Euro 20 billion of European chemical industry sales are through chemical distributors, who are also actively engaged in various phases of import/export trade that contributes significantly to the total chemical industry's annual positive balance of trade. The industrial customers served by chemical distributors use these materials to produce pharmaceuticals, food products, water purifiers, computers, paint and coatings, automobile parts, rubber compounds, fiberglass, textiles, detergents, plastics, cosmetics and toiletries, perfumes and many other products. The distribution industry which is inextricably tied to the safe transportation of chemicals is one of the most important aspects of the chemical industry, yet it is not represented at UNCETDG. ICCTA believes it could make a unique and valuable contribution particularly based on the daily and extensive experience of it's membership in the handling and transportation of dangerous goods by obtaining non-governmental status.

ICCTA was founded in 1991 as a forum of national associations of chemical distribution and trade worldwide. Membership may be granted to national associations, federations and regional groups representing chemical distribution and trade. ICCTA represents chemical distributors in more than 20 countries worldwide and its' members are committed to safe and responsible handling of chemical products in all phases of the distribution process, including handling, storage, warehousing and transportation.

ICCTA coordinates the work of all chemical distribution and trade associations on issues and programmes of international interest and provides a forum to discuss significant policy issues. Because of ICCTA's global representation before international groups, ICCTA could bring UNCETDG a synchronized perspective on various hazardous materials safety issues affecting chemical distribution. A list of ICCTA members is attached for reference.

ICCTA cooperates with the International Council of Chemical Associations (ICCA), which is the council of trade associations representing chemical manufacturers worldwide and is currently a non-governmental UN observer. ICCTA and ICCA are currently establishing cooperation in a number of areas such as health, safety and the environment. Both councils promote and coordinate Responsible Care/Responsible Distribution and other voluntary chemical industry safety initiatives.

We believe that the geographic and distribution diversity represented within ICCTA will be a valuable asset to the UNCETDG and we look forward to working with you in the interest of improved safety worldwide. Please let us know if you need additional information regarding ICCTA's activities.
