Paragraph 1., amend to read (including the amendment of the existing footnote $\underline{1 /}$ and the deletion of the reference to the footnote $\underline{2} /$ and footnote $2 /$ ):

## "1. SCOPE

This Regulation applies to vehicles of category $\mathrm{L}_{1} \underline{1}$ / with regard to the installation of lighting and light-signalling devices.
$\underline{1 /} \quad$ As defined in Annex 7 to the Consolidated Resolution on the Construction of Vehicles (R.E.3), (document TRANS/WP.29/78/Rev.1/Amend. 2 as last amended by Amend.4)."
