**HARMONIZATION OF REQUIREMENTS CONCERNING INTERNATIONAL

Status of international conventions and agreements on inland navigation issues

Note by the secretariat

It is recalled that the Inland Transport Committee, at its sixty-ninth session, noted that 52 accessions to UNECE transport agreements and conventions had been registered in 2006 and invited countries which have not yet done so, to become Contracting Parties to the legal instruments (ECE/TRANS/192, para. 31). The secretariat reproduces below the current status of legal instruments on inland navigation questions, adopted both within and outside UNECE, as well as the progress in a number of their Contracting Parties since the Rotterdam Conference in 2001.

The Working Party may wish to take note of the status of the instruments and decide on possible ways to proceed with regard to some of them which for one reason or another so far have not yet entered into force or have a limited number of Contracting States.
