### MISCELLANEOUS PROPOSALS OF AMENDMENTS TO THE MODEL REGULATIONS ON THE TRANSPORT OF DANGEROUS GOODS

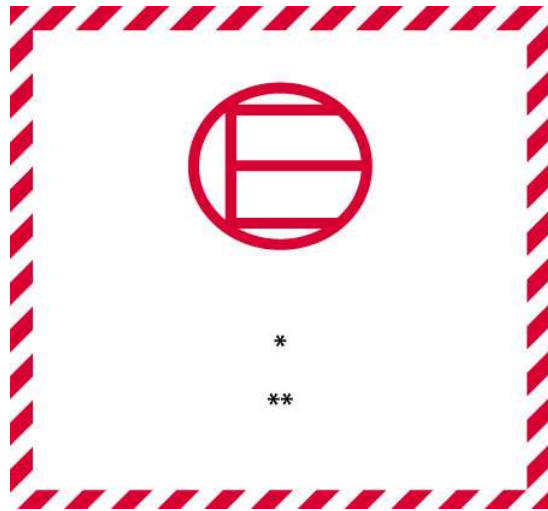
#### Representation of Excepted Quantities Mark

Transmitted by the International Air Transport Association (IATA)

1. The new provisions for dangerous goods in excepted quantities introduced into the 15<sup>th</sup> revised edition of the Model Regulations also included a requirement for a marking on packages, Figure 3.5.1.
2. The text of 3.5.4.2 states that “the dimensions of the mark shall be a minimum of 100mm x 100 mm.”, i.e. a square. However, the image of the mark shown in Figure 3.5.1 is rectangular.
3. While this may appear to be a trivial matter it is noted that minor variations between the Model Regulations and the modal regulations in the design of hazard labels led to a situation where carriers were being fined by transport inspectors for non-compliant labels.
4. It is therefore proposed that the image shown in Figure 3.5.1 be modified to the shape of a square.
