Assignment of SP 274

Transmitted by the European Chemical Industry Council (CEFIC)

- 1. In the previous biennium, CEFIC had introduced several documents on harmonizing the assignment of SP 274 amongst the different modes, in particular documents ST/SG/AC.10/C.3/2008/25, UN/SCETDG/33/INF.3 and ST/SG/AC.10/C.3/2008/63. At its thirty-fourth session the UNSCETDG meeting adopted the proposals made, except the assignment of SP 274 to the entries for Medicines.
- 2. During the discussion of the harmonization of the IMDG Code with the UN Recommendations, the E&T Group of the IMO DSC Sub-Committee noticed that UN 1707 (THALLIUM COMPOUND, N.O.S.) did not figure amongst the entries to which SP 274 should be assigned, although it is a substance of division 6.1, PG II, which was one of the criteria (criterion c) for assigning SP 274. Therefore the E&T Group decided to assign SP 274 to UN 1707 in Amendment 35-10 to the IMDG Code.
- 3. Cefic agrees that this is an omission and that indeed SP 274 should be assigned to UN 1707, which is already the case for RID, ADR and ADN.
- 4. Cefic meanwhile identified another omission: UN 2571 (ALKYLSULPHURIC ACIDS) is assigned SP 274 in the UN Model Regulations whereas this not the case in RID/ADR/ADN. This substance belongs to Class 8 (PG II) and does not meet the criterion, mentioned under 2 above (i.e. belonging to division 6.1), and therefore SP 274 should not be assigned to this entry.
- 5. In order to achieve full harmonization Cefic therefore proposes
 - Adding SP 274 in column 6 of the Dangerous Goods List for UN 1707
 - Removing SP 274 from column 6 of the Dangerous Goods List for UN 2571
