## The need for PPPs

- PPPs can help meet increasing infrastructure capacity requirements through:
  - Improving efficiency in delivery of services
  - Access to advanced technology
  - Financing infrastructure in developing countries
    - Financing gap in infrastructure = US\$ 220 billion/year
    - Gap in transport sector = US\$ 83 billion/year

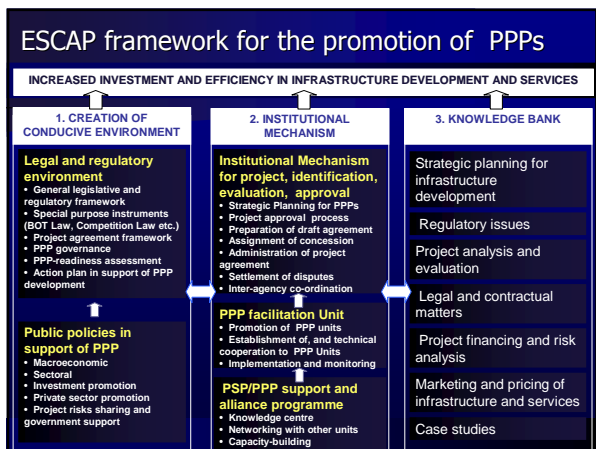

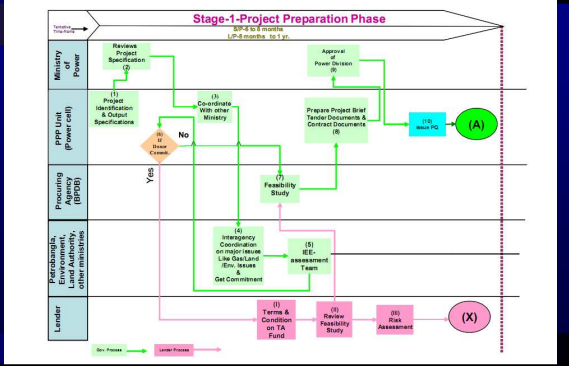

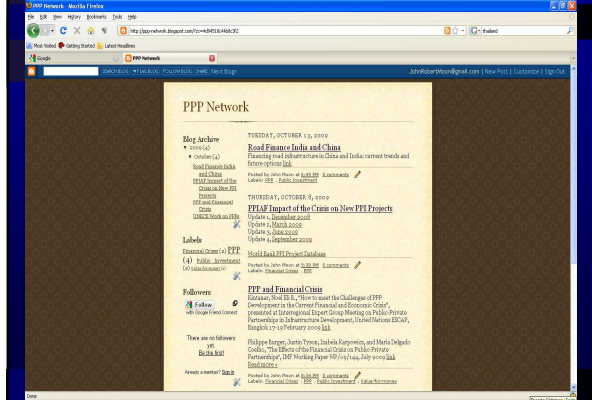
