### Virtual meeting of the IBC on Environment and Climate Change

**Date:** 21st April 2020 (09:30-12:30, Geneva time)

#### Background

At its special session on 20 March 2020, the Regional UN System Meeting saw the launch of the United Nations Inter-Agency Issue-Based Coalition (IBC) on Environment and Climate Change for Europe and Central Asia. The IBC has attracted 18 members from the UN family: FAO, ILO, IOM, ITU, OHCHR, UN Habitat, UN Women, UNDP, UNDRR, UNECE, UNEP, UNESCO, UNFCCC, UNICEF, UNOPS, WFP, WHO and WMO. The terms of reference and a short introduction to the IBC may be found on the UNECE website, where further resources will be added in due course.<sup>1</sup> Resident Coordinators have been asked to identify some initial priorities<sup>2</sup> and a review of all IBCs in the region is ongoing.

#### Meeting objective

The primary purpose of the IBC is to support UN Country Teams in their assistance to programme countries. Before engaging further with Country Teams and Resident Coordinators, it is important to agree within the Coalition how to work together to provide coordinated and effective support, including the context of the Covid-19 pandemic.
