



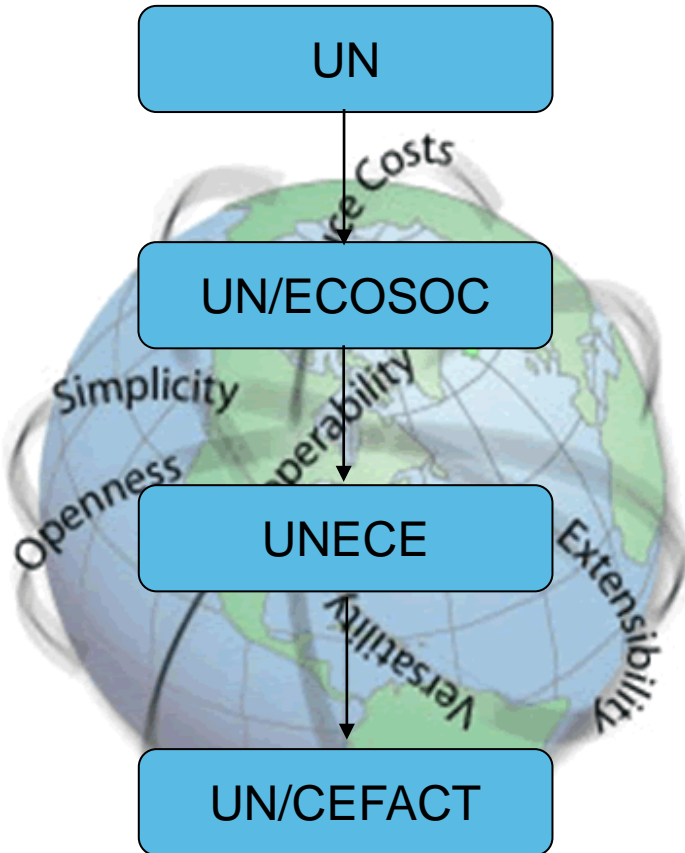

What is Trade Facilitation?

Facilitate: To make easy or easier

Trade Facilitation: The **simplification, standardization** and **harmonization of procedures** and associated **information flows** required to move goods from seller to buyer and to make payment

One of UNECE's key objectives is economic integration - Trade Facilitation and the efficient trade data interchange are the key tools to achieve this objective



TRADE FACILITATION

Simplification

Process of eliminating all unnecessary elements and duplications in formalities, processes and procedures

Harmonization

Alignment of national procedures, operations and documents with international conventions, standards and practices

Standardization

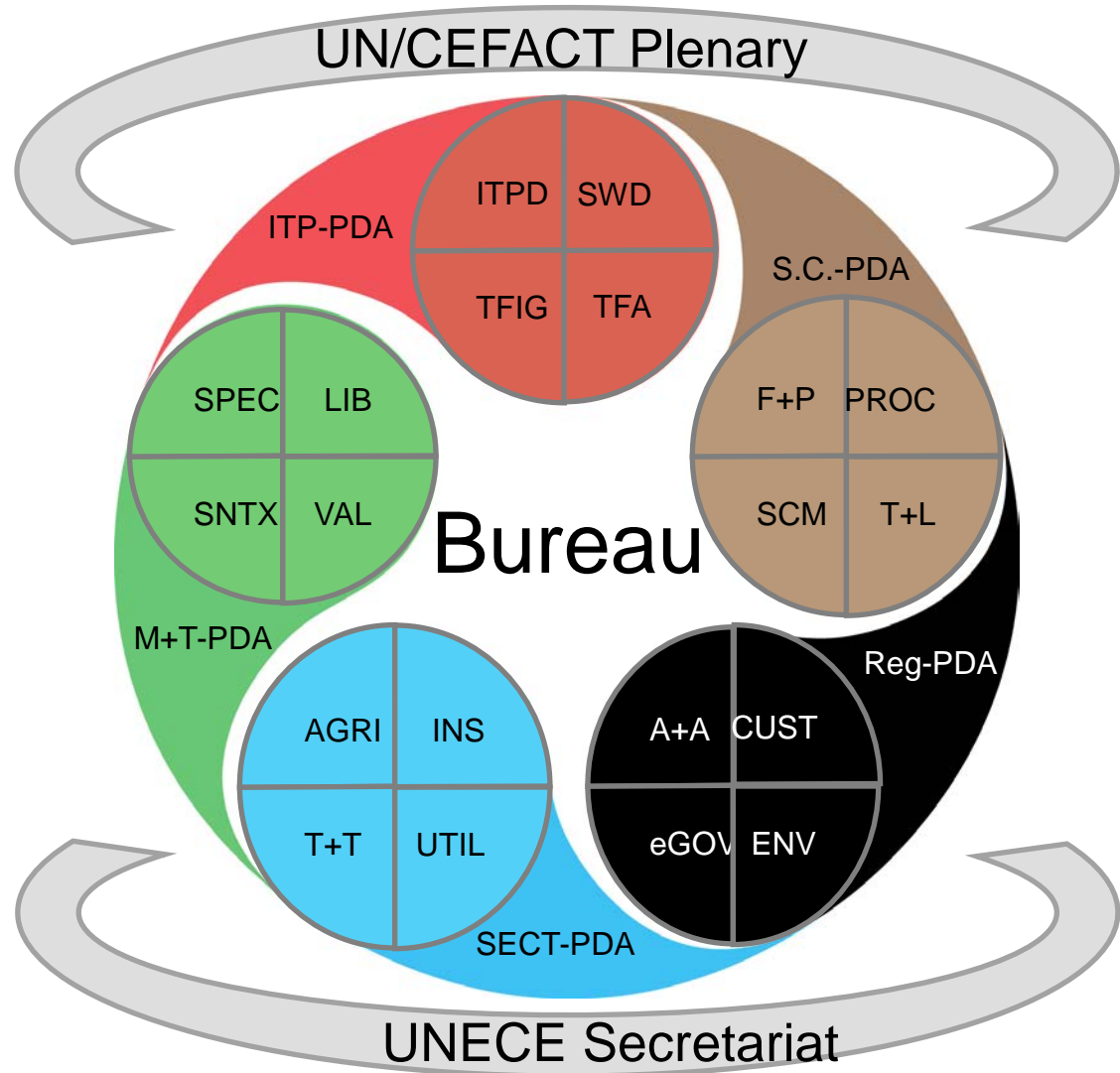
Process of developing internationally agreed formats for practices and procedures, documents and information

UN/CEFACT Mission

- UN/CEFACT's mission is to improve the ability of business, trade and administrative organizations, from developed, developing and transitional economies, to exchange products and relevant services effectively.
- Its principal focus is on facilitating national and international transactions, through the simplification and harmonization of processes, procedures and information flows, and so contribute to the growth of global commerce

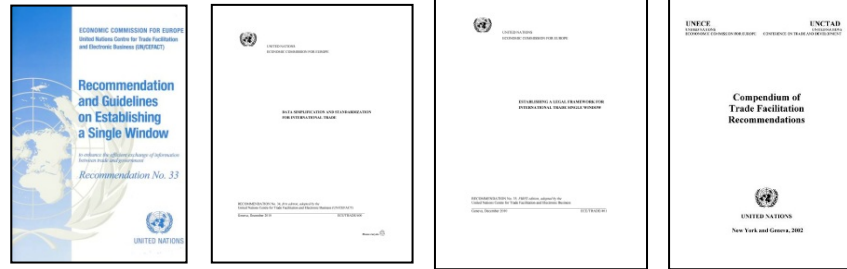

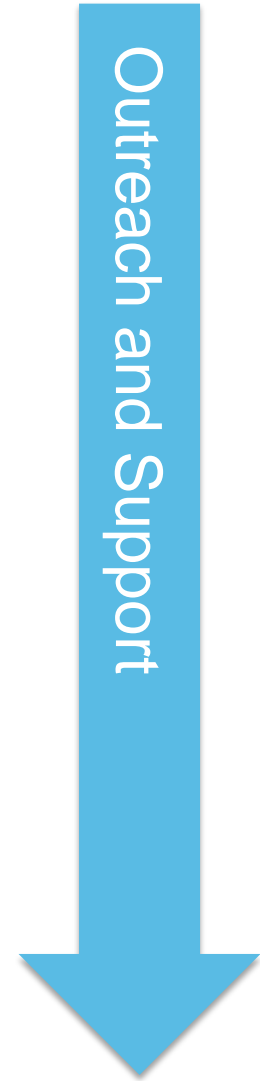
