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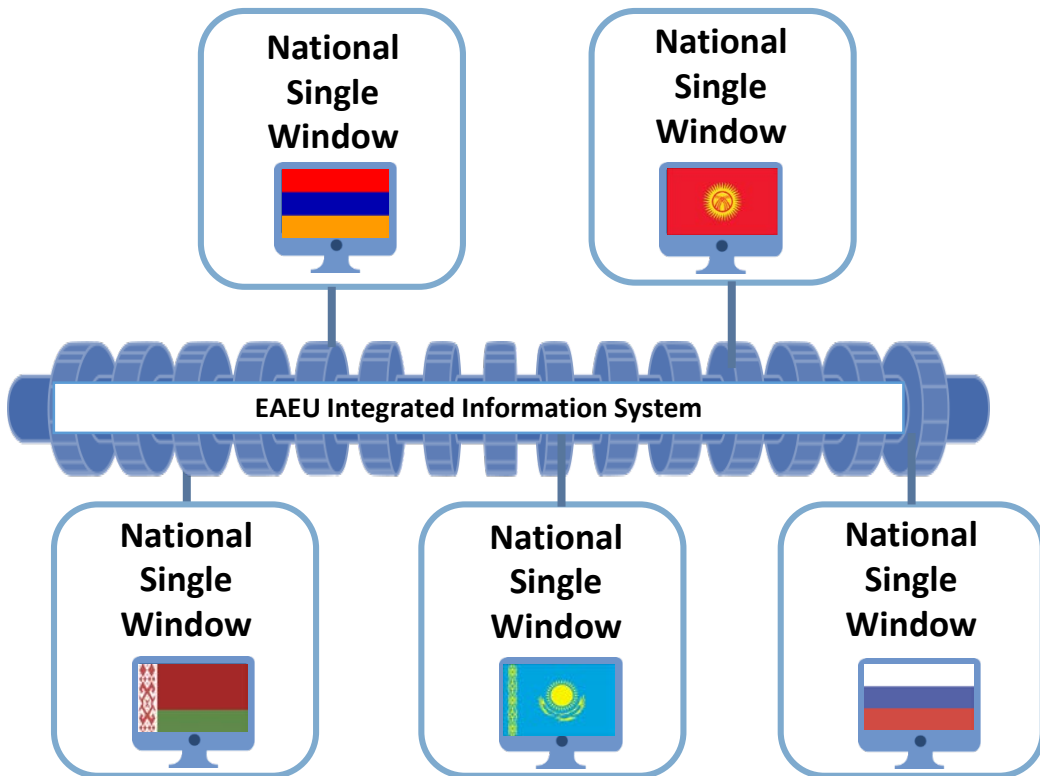

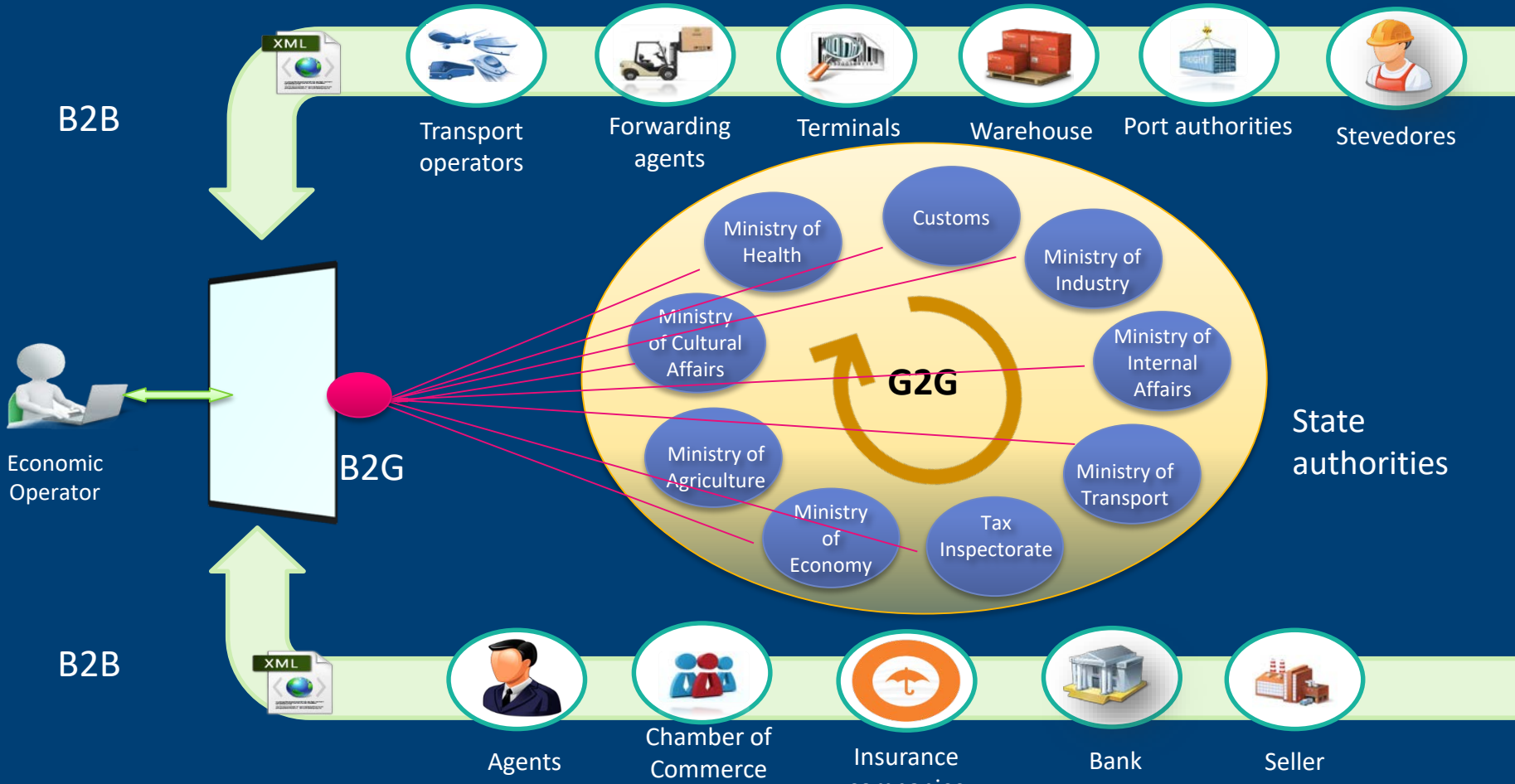

Basic principles of the Single Window development :

- Each country develops National Single Window (NSW);
- Coordination of efforts makes it possible to convergence approaches of the National Single Window development;
- Ensuring mutual recognition of electronic data;
- Using the infrastructure of the integrated information system of the Union for the organization of NSWs information exchange.

Preparation of reports and SW promotion

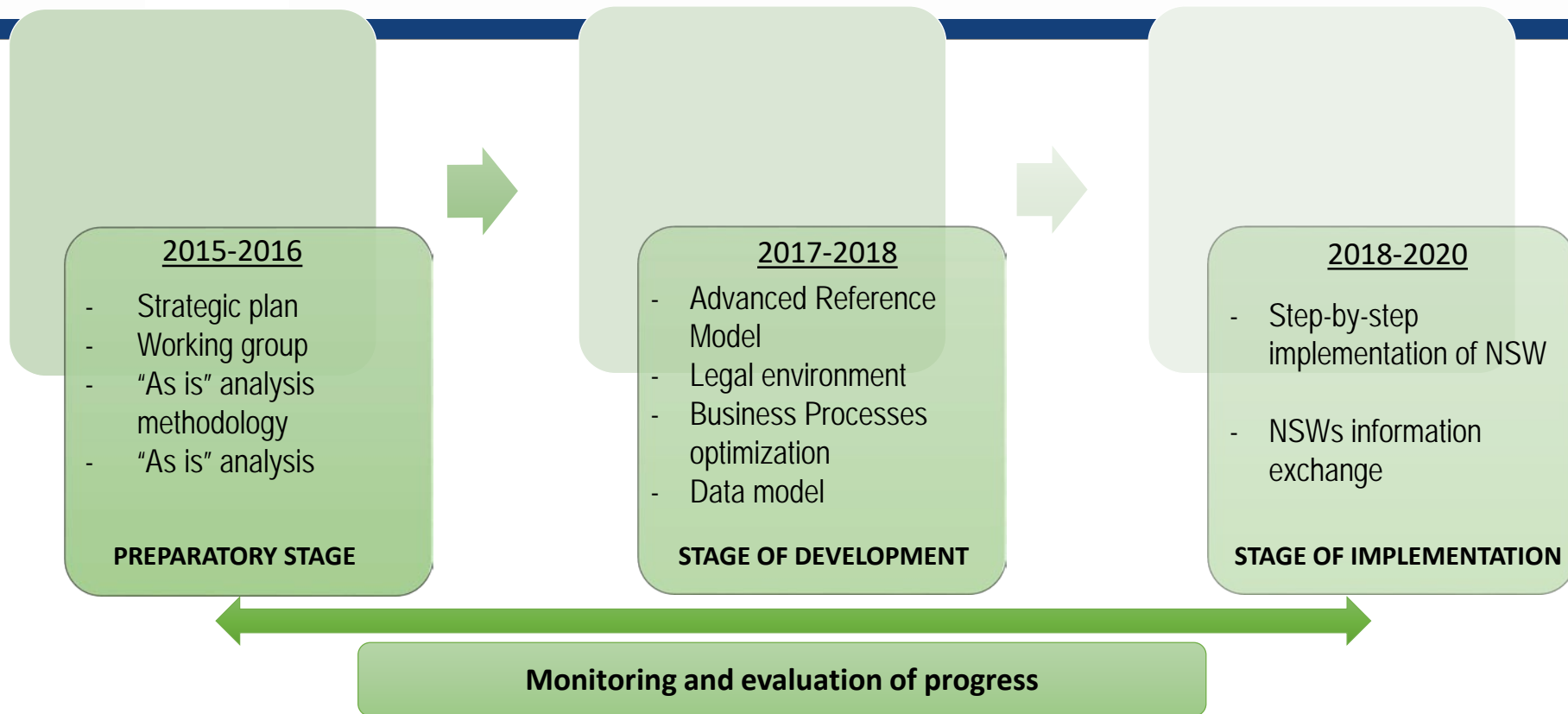


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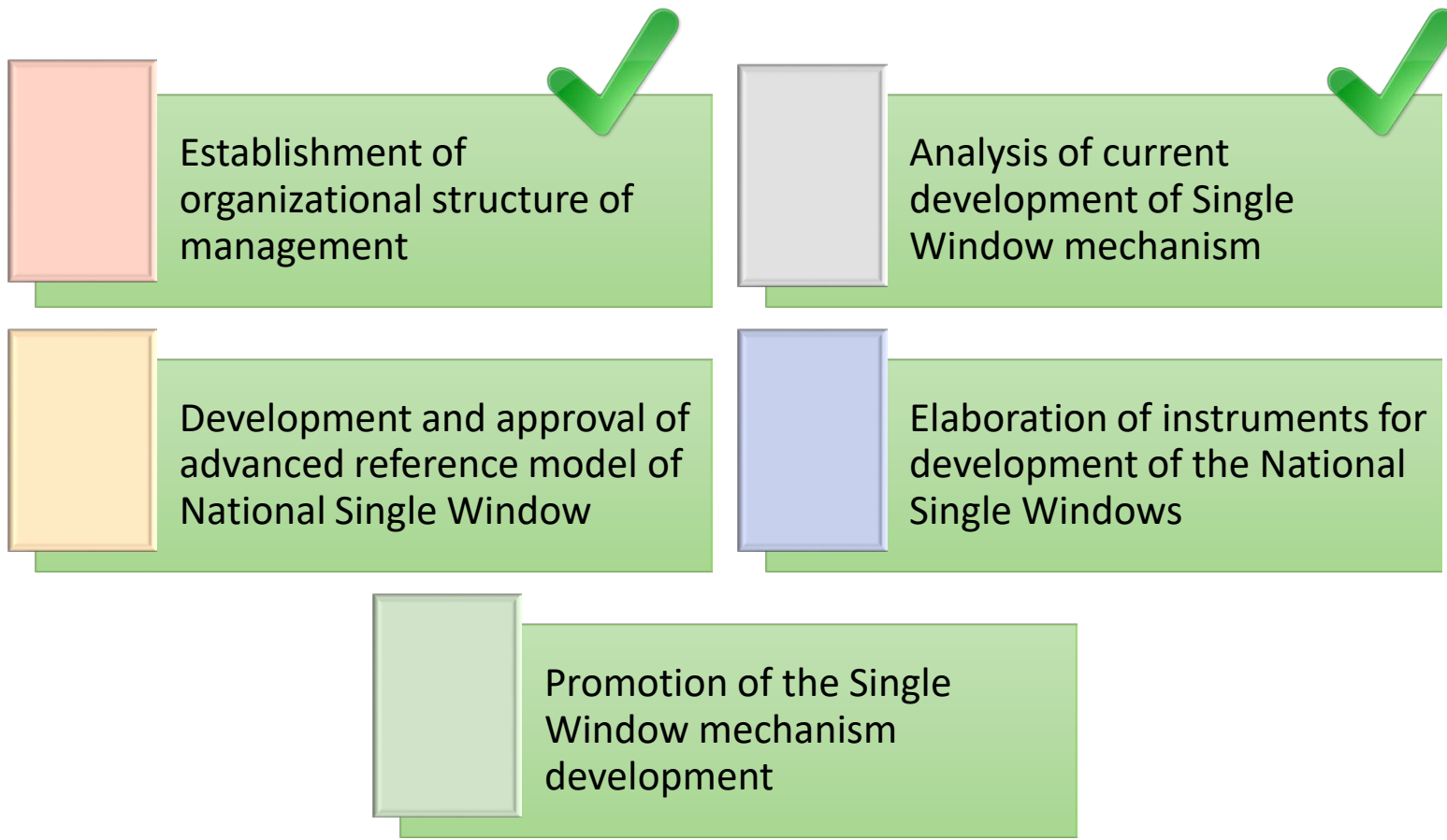

Absence of implemented projects of a National Single Window in the same wide scope like EAEU project has

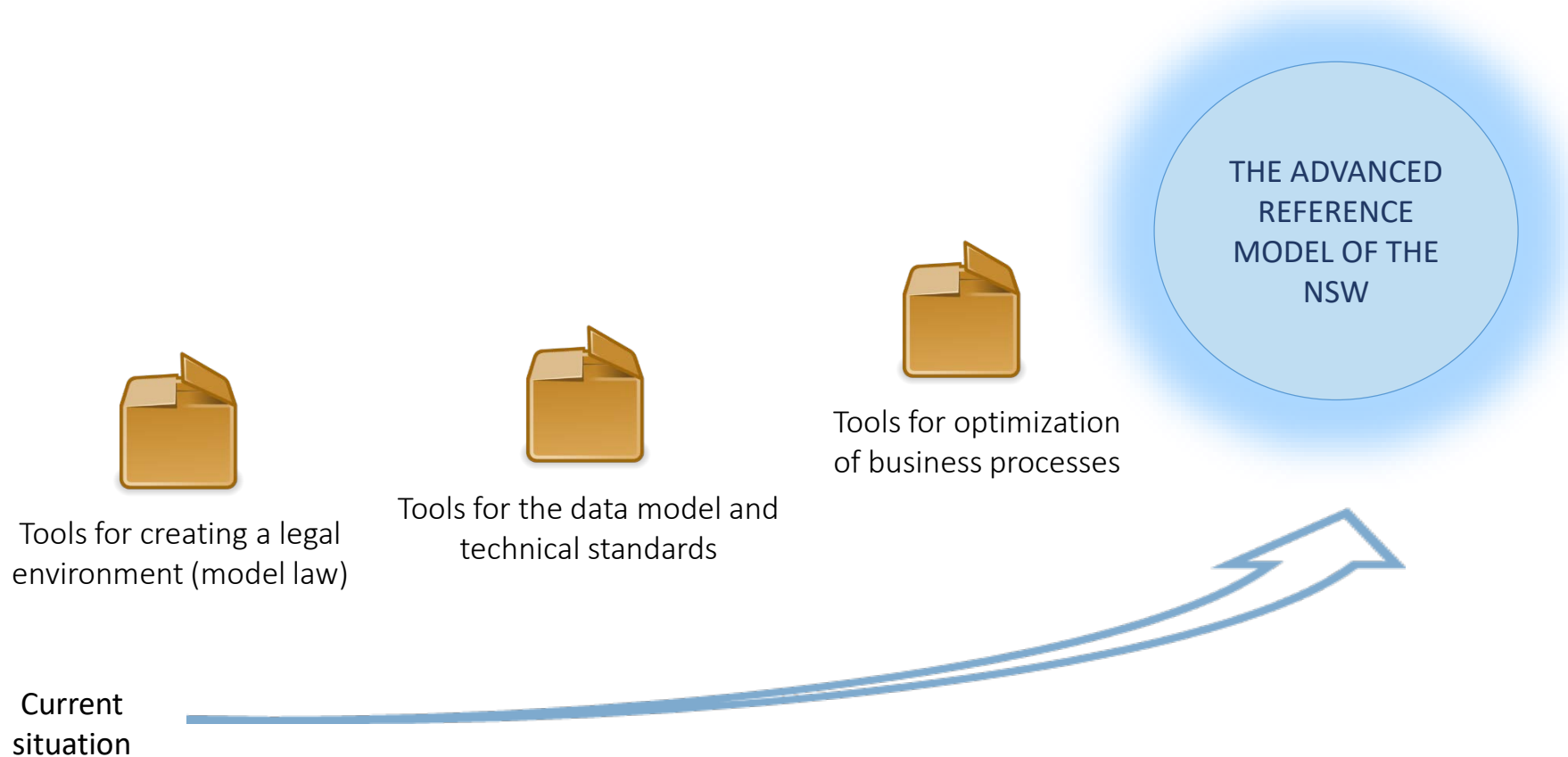


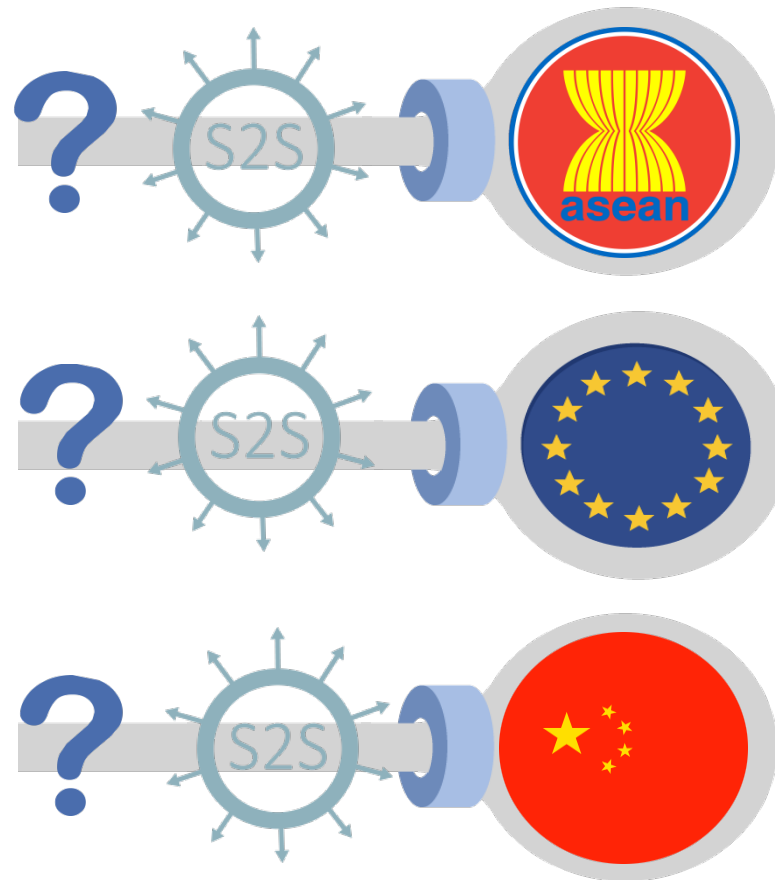
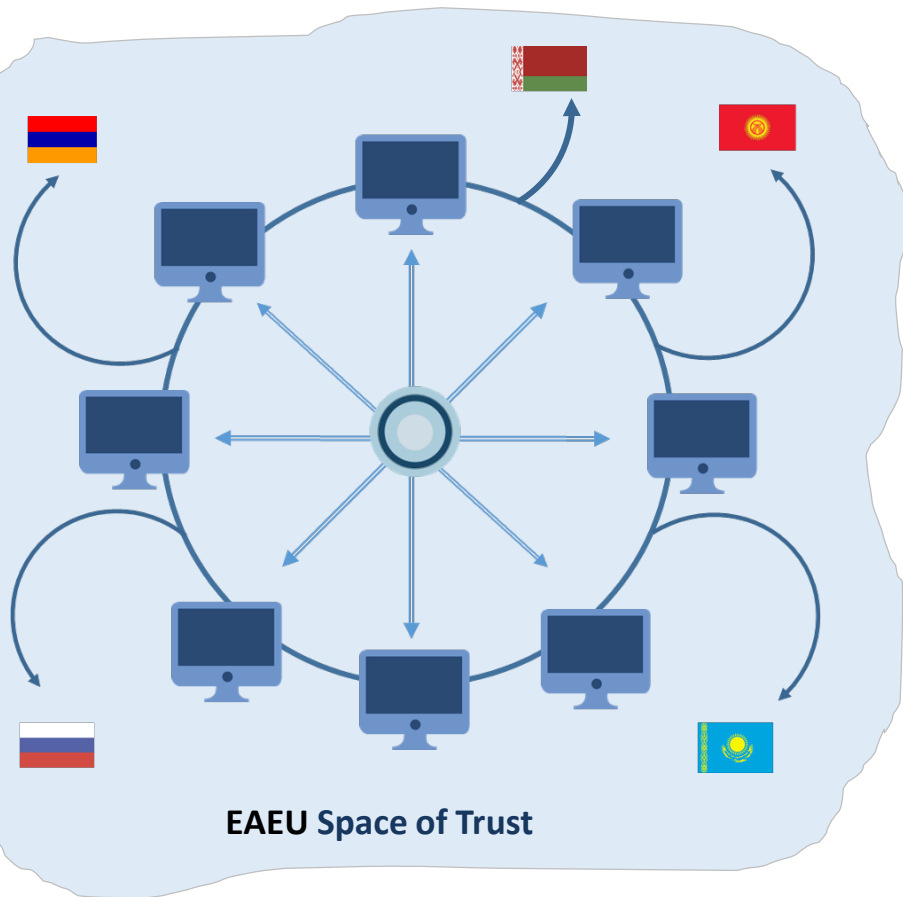
