### **General Notes**

1. The fifty-seventh session of the Commission (7-10 May 2002) will be preceded by a seminar on 6 May, on "Labour Market Challenges in the ECE Region". Debate under the session's agenda item 2 will draw upon the seminar's discussion.
2. There will be no formal meeting of the Commission on Thursday, 9 May as it is a United Nations holiday. Informal meetings among delegations will be facilitated by the secretariat.
3. In accordance with the Commission's Rules of Procedure, the documents referred to in the Provisional Agenda will, wherever possible, be transmitted to Governments in the Commission's three official languages (English, French, Russian) not less than forty-two days before the opening of the session, i.e. not later than 26 March 2002.
4. As part of the ongoing efforts of all concerned to revitalize the sessions of the Commission, and in keeping with the previous sessions of the Commission, the Bureau recommends that delegations, PSB Chairpersons and representatives from other organizations/initiatives should refrain from general statements and limit themselves to specific observations and proposals for action. Any delegation wishing to provide a text for distribution is requested to provide the secretariat, preferably in advance of the session, with sufficient copies (approximately 75).

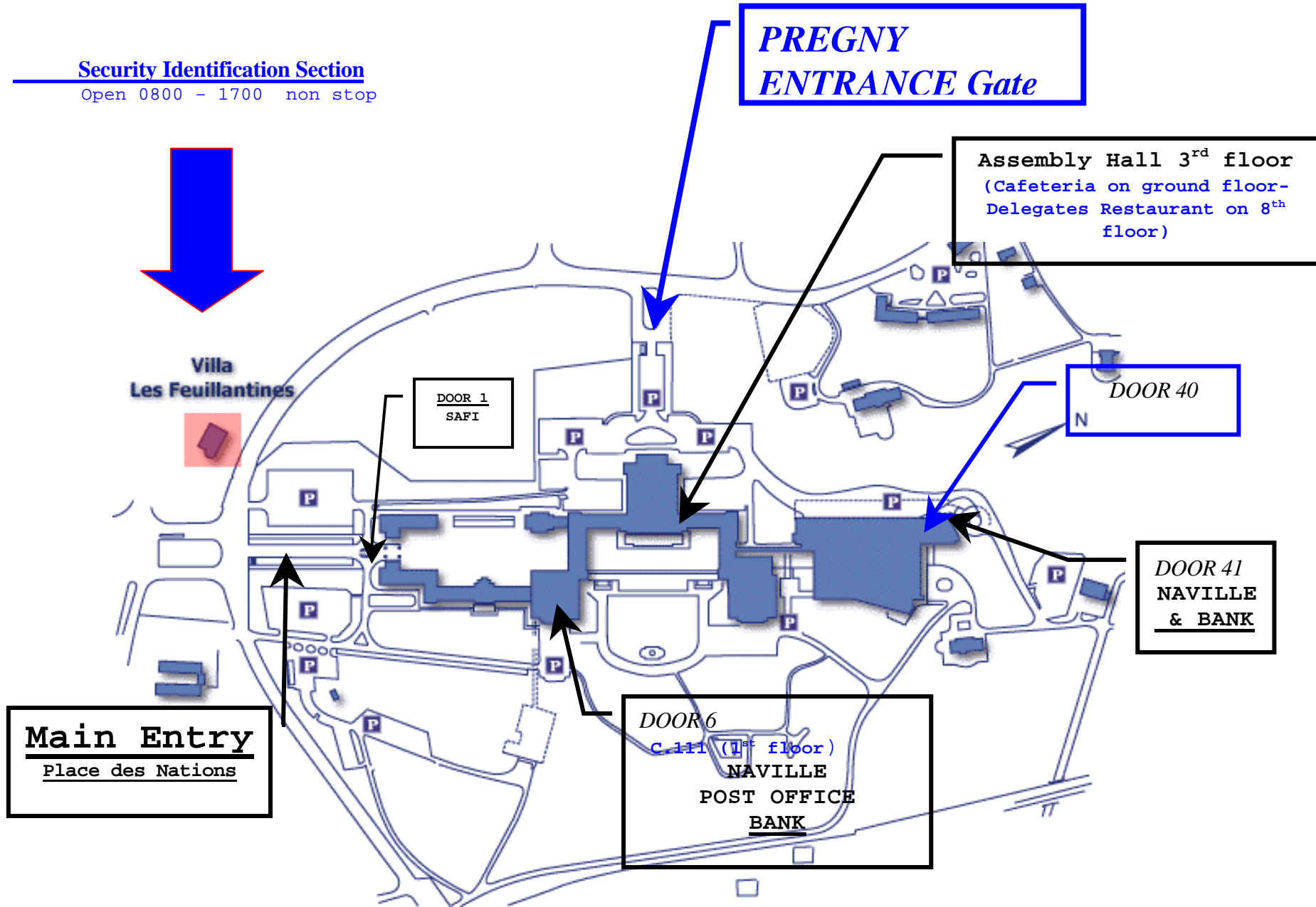
