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Global Methane Initiative (GMI)

GMI is a voluntary, multilateral partnership that aims to reduce methane emissions and to advance the abatement, recovery and use of methane as a clean energy source.

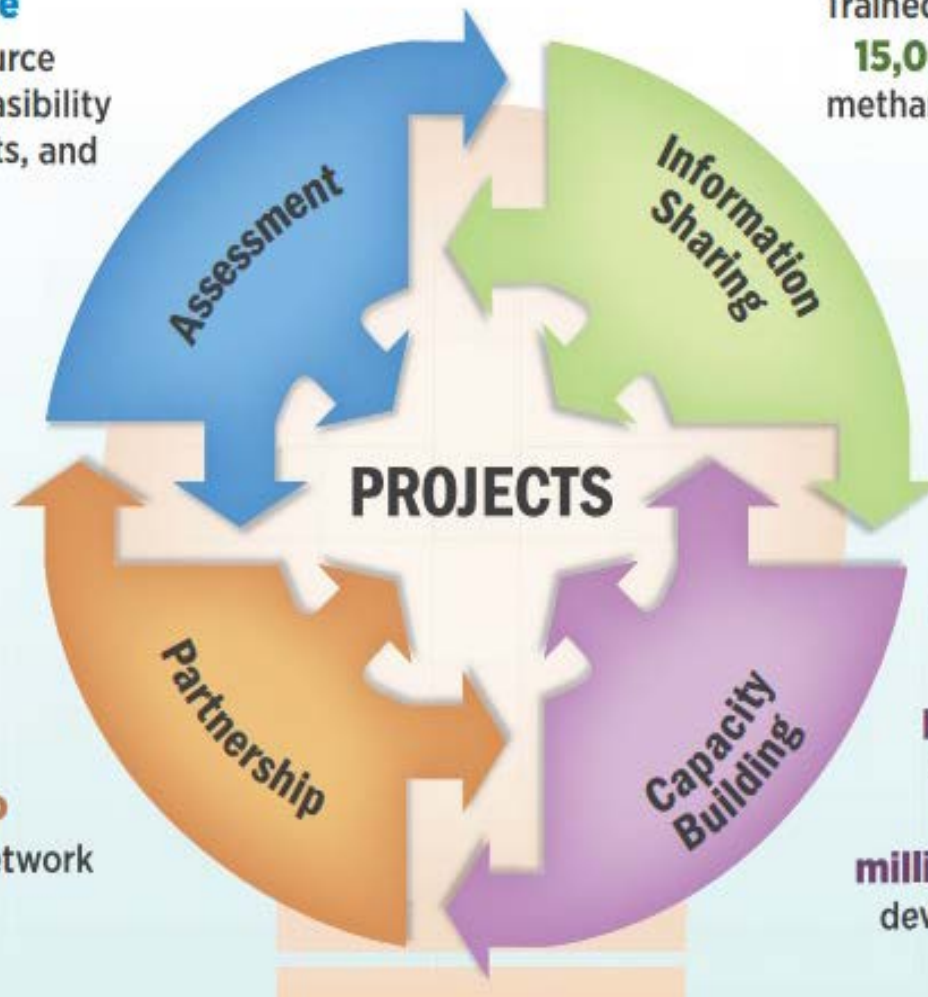
- Established in 2004
- 42 partner countries + European Commission
- More than 1,000 Project Network Members
- Targets five sector-specific areas for methane reduction
 - Agriculture
 - Coal Mines
 - Municipal Solid Waste
 - Municipal Wastewater
 - Oil & Gas Systems



Activities

Conducted **more than 600** resource assessments, feasibility studies, site visits, and study tours

Trained **more than 15,000** people in methane mitigation techniques



Grown **from 14 to 42** Partner Countries (plus the European Commission), and **from 100 to 1,300** Project Network members

Developed more than **50 tools and publications**, and leveraged nearly **\$550 million** for project development and training

GMI Oil and Gas Subcommittee

The Oil & Gas Subcommittee focuses on supporting the identification and deployment of practical and cost-effective methane mitigation technologies and practices through collaboration with governments, industry and other key stakeholders.

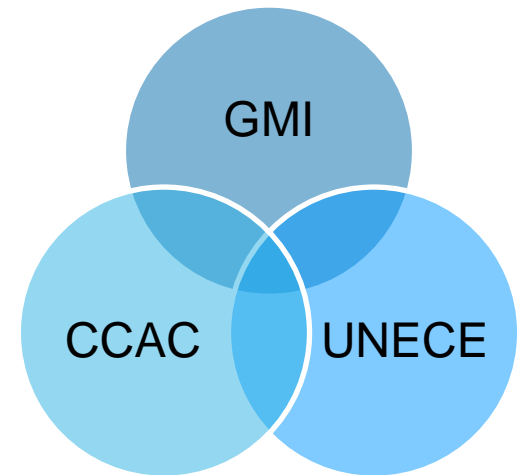
Accomplishments:

GMI Oil and Gas Alliances

Global Methane Forum

- March 2016 in Washington, D.C.
- More than 500 participants from 62 countries
- 22 Plenary Session speakers and 64 Technical Session speakers
- Extended GMI's charter by 5 years (through 2021)
- Formal alliances with CCAC and UNECE
- Jointly planned with CCAC Working Group
