The Conference of the Parties is invited to adopt the agenda for its second meeting as endorsed by the Bureau and set out in the present document.

The Chairperson will on the work and decisions taken by the Bureau and the activities and meetings held under the auspices of the Conference of the Parties since its first meeting on 22-24 November 2000.

At its first meeting, the Conference of the Parties elected: Mr. Ernst Berger (Switzerland) as Chairperson; Mr. Jürgen Wettig (European Commission) and Mr. Evgeny Gorshkov (Russian Federation) as Vice-Chairpersons; and Mr. Pal Popelyak (Hungary) and Mr. Ulf Bjurman (Sweden) as Bureau members representing Parties. Mr. Fabrizio Colcerasa (Italy), Mr. Janusz Żurek (Poland) and Mr. Jim Makris (United States) were elected as Bureau members representing other UNECE member countries. In accordance with the rules of procedure, the present Bureau members are eligible for re-election.

The Conference of the Parties is invited to review compliance with its decision 2000/2 on the implementation of the Convention.

(a) Working Group on Implementation

The Conference of the Parties, at its first meeting, established a Working Group on Implementation (ECE/CP.TEIA/2, annex III, decision 2000/2) to monitor the implementation of the Convention, prepare a report on the Convention's implementation, and draw conclusions and make recommendations. The Working Group also prepared a draft decision

on strengthening the implementation of the Convention based on the conclusions and recommendations that it drew from its report (CP.TEIA/2002/10).

The Working Group held its first meeting in Brussels on 23-24 May 2002 (WGI2/10 June 2002). Its Chairman will report on the outcome of the meeting and the work carried out by the Working Group.

(b) First report on the implementation of the Convention

The Chairman of the Working Group on Implementation will inform the Conference of the Parties on the process of reporting on implementation by the Parties and other UNECE member countries.

The Conference of the Parties is invited to discuss and evaluate the process. Parties are invited to share their experience with the reporting form. Parties that did not report on the implementation of the Convention will have an opportunity to explain why they were not able to respond.

The Chairman of the Working Group will then introduce the first report on the implementation of the Convention (CP.TEIA/2002/9), prepared by the Working Group on the basis of the reporting forms that it received from Parties and other UNECE member countries, and in particular he will focus on the: (i) designation of competent authorities; (ii) identification of hazardous activities; (iii) application of the UNECE Industrial Accident Notification System and designation of points of contact; (iv) establishment of bilateral, cross-border cooperation aimed at the prevention of, preparedness for and response to industrial accidents and mitigation of their transboundary effects.

(i) Designation of competent authorities

In accordance with article 17, paragraph 1, of the Convention, each Party should have designated or established a competent authority for the purposes of the Convention and, in accordance with paragraph 3, it should have provided this information through the secretariat to the other Parties within three months of the date of entry into force of the Convention for that Party.

The Chairman of the Working Group on Implementation will provide information on the status of designation of competent authorities.

Parties that have not yet designated a competent authority for the purpose of the Convention will have an opportunity to explain their delay in complying with the above provision of the Convention.

(ii) Identification of hazardous activities – decision 2000/3

In accordance with article 4, paragraph 1, of the Convention, the Parties should have identified existing or proposed hazardous activities in their country and notified any potentially affected Party of their existence as soon as possible but

not later than the time frame provided for in annex III, paragraph 2, to the Convention. In order to facilitate the identification of hazardous activities, the Conference of the Parties agreed on guidelines to facilitate the identification of hazardous activities (ECE/CP.TEIA/2, annex IV, decision 2000/3, appendix). Parties were also requested, and other UNECE member countries were invited, to report the information on these hazardous activities with their implementation reporting form (question 7).

The Chairman of the Working Group on Implementation will provide information on the status of the identification of hazardous activities.

Parties that have not yet identified their hazardous activities within their jurisdiction and notified their neighbouring countries will have an opportunity to explain their delay in complying with the above provision of the Convention.

(iii) Designation of points of contact and application of the UNECE Industrial Accident Notification System – decision 2000/1

Parties, in accordance with article 17, paragraphs 2, 3, 5 and 6, of the Convention, should have designated points of contact for the purposes of industrial accident notification and mutual assistance, informed the other Parties and maintained them operational at all times. The Conference of the Parties, at its first meeting, requested Parties, and invited other UNECE member countries, to use the UNECE Industrial Accident Notification System for the transmission of early-warning, information and assistance request reports, at national level, in the event of a major accident or during tests (ECE/CP.TEIA/2, annex II, decision 2000/1).

The secretariat will provide information on the current status of the network of points of contact and on the results of the last two tests of the UNECE Industrial Accident Notification System.

Parties that have not yet designated points of contact or whose points of contact were not operational during the tests will have an opportunity to explain their delay in complying with the above provisions of the Convention.

(iv) Establishment of bilateral, cross-border cooperation

Cross-border cooperation, at the national, regional and, in particular, local level, is a key element in implementing the Convention and preventing, preparing for and responding to industrial accidents and mitigating their transboundary effects. Progress in building cooperation schemes to exchange information and draw up joint preparedness and response measures is uneven. In some countries this process has still to be initiated. On the other hand, many countries have already entered into discussions, some of which have resulted in effective bilateral relations.

The delegations of Germany and Hungary have agreed to share their experience in establishing and expanding cooperation arrangements with their neighbouring countries. The Conference of the Parties will have an opportunity to hear their presentations.

(c) Strengthening the implementation of the Convention

The Conference of the Parties is invited to discuss and endorse the Report on the Implementation of the Convention as contained in CP.TEIA/2002/9.

The Chairman of the Working Group on Implementation will introduce the draft decision on strengthening the implementation of the Convention (CP.TEIA/2002/10), including the conclusions and recommendations, which the Working Group drew up on the basis of the report on the implementation of the Convention.

The Conference of the Parties is invited to thoroughly discuss the draft decision, give guidance to the Bureau and the Working Group on Implementation for their further work and possible activities to strengthen the implementation of the Convention throughout the UNECE region.

Finally, the Parties are invited to adopt the decision on strengthening the implementation of the Convention, on the basis of its draft and of the outcome of the above discussion.

(d) Election of members of the Working Group on Implementation for 2003-2004

Parties are invited to nominate candidates for the Working Group on Implementation. According to the terms of reference of the Working Group on Implementation (decision 2000/2, appendix), the Conference of the Parties is invited to elect up to ten members of the Working Group from among the candidates nominated by Parties for a term until its next meeting. The members currently serving on the Working Group (Mr. A. Heidler (Austria), Mr. E. Malasek (Czech Republic), Mr. L. Katai-Urban (Hungary), Mr. S. Galitchi (Republic of Moldova), Mr. J. Wettig (European Commission), Mr. U. Bjurman (Sweden) and Mr. B. Gay (Switzerland)) are eligible for re-election.

Preparations for the workshop, including individual country replies to a questionnaire, the drawing-up of the background paper and the nomination of country representatives, took more time than originally planned. The Bureau of the Conference of the Parties, in consultation with the host country, therefore decided to postpone the event until 13-15 March 2003.

The Conference of the Parties is invited to discuss and endorse the background paper. It may also wish to give further guidance to the Bureau and the Working Group on Implementation on the substance of the Workshop.

They were held under the joint auspices of the Conference of the Parties and the Meeting of the Parties to the Water Convention.

(i) International workshop and exercise on industrial safety and water protection in transboundary river basins

The delegation of Hungary will report on the exercise and the outcome and conclusions of the workshop, which took place in Tiszaújváros (Hungary) on 3-5 October 2001.

(ii) Polish-Russian transboundary response exercise “Kotki 2002” and international seminar on preparedness for and response to industrial accidents and the mitigation of their transboundary effects

The delegations of Poland and the Russian Federation will report on the transboundary response exercise and the outcome and conclusions of the seminar, which took place in Kętrzyn (Poland) on 13-15 June 2002.
