2. Relevant developments since the previous meeting of the Committee

The Committee will be invited to share any information on relevant developments since its previous meeting that is not covered under other agenda items.

3. Other matters arising from previous meetings

The Committee will be invited to discuss any matters arising from its previous meetings.

4. Submissions by Parties concerning other Parties

The Committee is expected to consider, in accordance with the relevant procedures, any submission made by a Party concerning another Party's compliance with its obligations under the Convention, as provided for under paragraph 15 of the annex to decision I/7.

5. Submissions by Parties concerning their own compliance

The Committee is expected to consider, in accordance with the relevant procedures, any submission made by a Party concerning its own compliance with the obligations under the Convention, as provided for under paragraph 16 of the annex to decision I/7.

6. Referrals by the secretariat

The Committee is expected to consider, in accordance with the relevant procedures, any referral made by the secretariat concerning possible non-compliance by a Party with its obligations under the Convention, as provided for under paragraph 17 of the annex to decision I/7.

7. Communications from members of the public

The Committee is mandated to consider, in accordance with the relevant procedures, communications from the public, as provided for under chapter VI of the annex to decision I/7.

(a) The Committee is expected to adopt its findings and, as appropriate, recommendations with regard to communications ACCC/C/2004/06 (Kazakhstan) and ACCC/C/2004/08 (Armenia).

(b) The Committee is also expected to complete its preparation of draft findings and, as appropriate, recommendations, with regard to communication ACCC/C/2005/11 (Belgium).

(c) Subject to its final determination on admissibility to be made in the intersessional period (ECE/MP.PP/C.1/2005/8, para. 16), the Committee is expected to resume its discussion on the substance of communication ACCC/C/2005/12 (Albania). The Committee is also expected to discuss the content of communications ACCC/C/2005/13 (Hungary) and ACCC/C/2005/15 (Romania). In accordance with chapter IX of the annex to decision I/7 of the Meeting of the Parties, the Party concerned and the communicant are entitled to participate in the discussion on the subject matter of each communication, though not in the preparation or adoption of any findings, measures or recommendations of the Committee.

(d) The Committee will review any responses received from the communicant in relation to communication ACCC/C/2005/14 (Poland) (ECE/MP.PP/C.1/2005/8, para. 20).

(e) The Committee will discuss any new communications received sufficiently in advance of the meeting, in particular with respect to their admissibility and any issues that may need to be raised with the Party concerned.

(f) The Committee may discuss any other possible issues related to communications.

8. Other information received by the Committee relevant to possible cases of non-compliance

The Committee is expected to consider any other information relevant to possible non-compliance which has been brought to its attention.

9. Follow -up on specific cases of non-compliance

The Committee will be invited to discuss any progress with regard to implementation of decisions II/5, II/5a, II/5b and II/5c of the Meeting of the Parties (ECE/MP.PP/2005/2/Add.6-9), taking into account any responses received from the Parties concerned (ECE/MP.PP/C.1/2005/8, para. 24).

10. Review of compliance with the reporting requirements and procedures for addressing compliance issues arising from the implementation reports

The Committee will be invited to consider whether and how the thematic compliance issues emerging from the review of national implementation reports might need to be addressed in its next report to the Meeting of the Parties (ECE/MP.PP/C.1/2005/8, para. 27).
