- Establishment of expert group
- Support from Norway, Romania and WECF
- Cooperation with the Aarhus Convention's Task Force on Public Participation in Decision-Making
- Invitation for comments, submission to MOP for adoption in November 2013



- Assistance to Parties to comply with obligations related to pp
- Addresses public authorities to provide guidance in implementing pp under articles 6 and 7, also 9 and 10
- Assistance to Signatories and non-Parties to raise awareness and ensure public information
- Addresses the public, NGOs and representatives of civil society





- Challenges provided basis for approach
- Guide leading, directing and advising
- Concrete recommendations
- Tools, measures and steps (beyond required standards)
- Reference to existing guidance (in particular re Aarhus Convention)

What is needed under the national framework?

- Awareness raising
- Identification of stakeholders/coordination mechanisms
- Cost, time and human resources

Specific Provisions under the Protocol

- Target setting (6.2) and water-management plan development (6.5): baseline analysis; notification; involvement of public; taking outcomes into account
- Reporting
- Internat. Coordination
- Compliance Committee





Tool Box

Presentation of different tools to be used within specific steps of the process (identify, notify, inform, consult, take into consideration)





- PP has to be applied during Protocol's implementation (art. 6.2, 6.5, 11 to 14 and 7.5)
- Stakeholder identification requires balanced approach and equal opportunities
- Cost, time and human resources are important factors
- Information provision lies within responsibility of public authorities
- Setting of time frames requires flexible approach
- "Taking into due account" is a legal obligation
