


Introduction to the aims and the programme of the workshop on water allocation in transboundary basins



How the Water Convention supports cooperation on transboundary waters

- The main objective of the Water Convention is to promote the sustainable management of transboundary water resources through cooperation and the prevention of conflicts
- The Convention's programme of work tackles emerging issues upon request by Parties and non-Parties
- Activities include capacity building, exchange of experience, development of soft law and projects on the ground

Objectives of the workshop

- Support efforts to develop sustainable and equitable transboundary arrangements on water allocation that strike a balance between robustness and flexibility
- Increase understanding and knowledge of criteria, mechanisms and tools for water allocation in transboundary basins and aquifers
- Promote the exchange of experiences and good (and bad) practices

Programme (Day 1)

- Session 1: Considerations for Water allocation
 Session objectives: Provide an overview of water allocation considerations in theory and practice.
- Small group discussions:
 - Experiences with water allocation;

- Session 2: Informing Water allocation decisions to deal with conflicting interests and uses
 Session objectives: Understand the data needs and other requirements to inform water allocation decisions in the transboundary context, including modelling approaches and stakeholder participation.
- Expert Panel answering questions on water allocation

- Session 3: Process of agreeing about water allocation
 Session objectives: Learn about different steps towards agreeing on water allocation, including building trust and addressing the joint management of infrastructure.
- Session 4: Implementation of water allocation arrangements; challenges, lessons learned and success factors
 Session objectives: Explore enabling factors and challenges in implementing water allocation arrangements, in particular in light of changing hydrological patterns.
- Session 5: Final reflections and Conclusions
- Small group discussions: What are countries' needs on water allocation in the transboundary context? How could the Water Convention respond to such needs?
