
# Scaling-up national capacity building activities using good practice-based approaches/1

## National workshops and country missions – based on developed guidance documents

#### **Objectives:**

- Review the evidence based on the situation of small systems with identification of particular challenges and development of country-specific recommendations
- \* Introduce good practices, tools and experiences from other countries of the European Region related to regulation, safe management and surveillance of small systems
- \* Support countries in developing of national targets
- \* Identify ways and means to improve the situation of small systems





Continuation of strengthening national capacity building activities under current programme of work (since 2016)

### Sub-regional workshop on improving smallscale water supply and sanitation

### Minsk, Belarus, 15-17 March 2017

Participating countries: Belarus, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Republic of Moldova, Russian Federation and Ukraine

Objective: Facilitate a sub-regional exchange on experiences related to safe and sustainable services in rural areas and promote good practices towards their improvement

Outcomes: Step-by-step improvement based on the country needs, priorities and available resources; broad support to: WSPs and SSPs approaches, risk-based surveillance principles, legal requirement for private wells and sustainable financing of small systems



# National workshop on small-scale water supply and sanitation in Uzbekistan

Tashkent, Uzbekistan, 6-8 September 2017

Objective: Support to Uzbekistan's efforts in strengthening capacities towards safe and efficient management and surveillance of small-scale water supply services

Outcomes: Identified steps towards improving the situation of small systems, including an increase of policy attention, involvement of key stakeholders and support for safely managing small-scale systems. Existing institutional capacities to be used as an additional supportive mechanism



### Sub-regional workshop on improving smallscale water supply and sanitation

Belgrade, Serbia, 10-12 October 2017

<u>Participating countries</u>: Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, FYR Macedonia, Montenegro, Romania and Serbia

Objectives: Exchange knowledge, information and experiences related to all aspects relevant for safe and sustainable services in rural areas; promote good practices for their improvements



<u>Outcomes</u>: Small systems to be explicitly considered in target setting under the Protocol; small system-specific regulatory requirements; baseline analysis (e.g. rapid assessments), inventory of small systems; guidance, technical standards and tools for private wells; uptake and scaling-up of WSPs and SSPs; enforcing and improving surveillance of SSWSS in rural areas; minimum qualification requirements for operators of small systems

# Implementation of the field demonstration projects

Ongoing project: "Small and safe: scaling-up water safety planning and effective water quality monitoring in rural Tajikistan" (until mid-2018)

**Objectives:** Building capacities for scaling-up of WSP in rural Tajikistan

Training of national WSP facilitators, WSP road map development, WSP guideline for long-term policy uptake, sustainable strategies to drinking-water quality monitoring and promotion of the human rights to water and sanitation



## What actions RADWQ survey triggered in Serbia to improve small-scale water supplies?

### **Policy actions:**

\* Introduction and implementation of mandatory WSP in the draft new law on water intended for human consumption

#### **Enforcement of existing regulation:**

\* Increase enforcement of regulation on the foundation and ownership of water supply systems regardless of their size

### Improving evidence base:

Establishing national register on small-scale water supply systems (GIS)
