


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
SDG 6 global monitoring

Objectives 2017



 To generate a critical mass of baseline data for each indicator

2. To initiate a process of developing capacity in countries for integrated monitoring



November 2016: Invitation to participate in integrated baseline process from UN-Water

March-September 2017: Implementation of SDG 6 monitoring; Technical and institutional support from Integrated Monitoring Initiative to countries

August-September 2017: Validation of country data with countries

November 2017: Final baseline data on SDG 6 indicators submitted to custodian agencies

Spring 2018: Publication of SDG Progress Report 2018 by UNSD, publication of UN-Water synthesis report on SDG 6, based on baseline data

Summer 2018: HLPF in-depth review of progress towards SDG 6
